It commemorates Nevada's frontier legacy and its entry into the Union as the 36th state on October 31 in 1864. Nevada's symbols include: the Desert Bighorn Sheep (state animal); the Mountain Blue Bird (state bird); the Lahontan Cutthroat Trout (state fish); the sagebrush (state flower); the Ichthyosaur (state fossil); the black fire opal (state precious gem); and the desert tortoise (state reptile). Nevada's state song is "Home Means Nevada", the state slogan is "Battle Born", and the state colors are silver and blue.

Pastor's Note

Dear friends,



I am writing to you with great concern. For the last few months, the Precious Blood has not been distributed during some of the Masses. Many of you continue to ask why. The simple truth is that there are not enough ministers for the cup. In fact, this is true for both species. Ministers are not showing up when they have been scheduled. Sacristans and faithful Eucharistic Ministers run around frantically minutes before mass hoping to find a substitute. This is inexcusable. When a Eucharistic Minister is commissioned he or she assumes the responsibility of serving and fulfilling their commitment. If this lack of ministers continues, we will be forced to eliminate serving from the cup. As you can imagine, this is not what I want nor what the faith community wants. However, I see no other option. Therefore, once again I plead the ministers who have been commissioned to graciously and faithfully assume your responsibilities. When you know ahead of time that you will not be available, contact Mary Santos by the 15th of that month. Of course there are circumstances that we can not foresee-for example, being sick. When this happens please call another minister who can take your place. If you do not show up when we are expecting you, you are doing a disservice to yourself and the community you are trying to serve.

From early summer to present, over 300 of our parish families have been forced to leave the valley due to unemployment and foreclosures. This great loss has resulted in lower numbers of attendance and reduced income. We have done everything possible to trim the budget, pay our mortgage, and keep parish programs running. As is to be expected, we have also seen a spike in the number of families coming to outreach. I ask you to please remember these families in your prayers. Give thanks to God for the blessings he has bestowed on you, but also concern yourself for the less fortunate. Pray for our country and the economic stability of the whole world-Pray that we may have peace and harmony.

Finally, like many of you, I also find that I am struggling with the new sung responses during Mass. Please be patient with me and with yourself. This will take all of us some time to get used to. May God bless you,

Do you know the date of your Baptism? Well, on that day, you became a missionary, called by our Lord to share your faith with those around you – and to be part of the church's mission to the world.

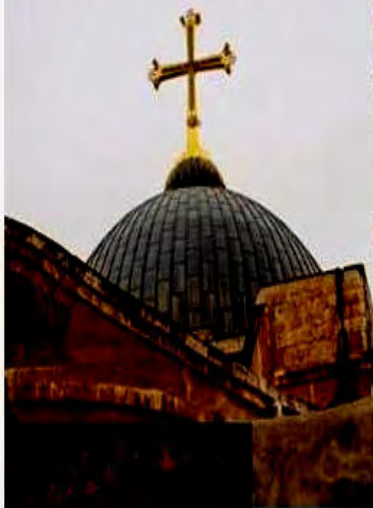

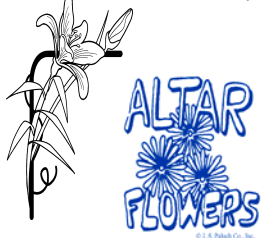

Preparing For the New Translation of the Mass (part 8 of 12)

New Words in the Introductory Rites

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of *The Roman Missal*.

This week, we will look more closely at some of the changes in the words and phrases that we will pray. At first some of these may seem awkward or uncomfortable, but over the course of time they will become familiar.

After the Sign of the Cross, when the priest says, “The Lord be with you,” our response will be “And with your spirit.” This response will occur at three other very important moments in the Mass (Gospel, Eucharistic Prayer, dismissal) as well, each one a time when we recognize the Holy Spirit moving in our midst.

The Gloria will be mostly familiar, but some words will be in a different order, and there will be a few small additions as well. For example, at the beginning of the Gloria, we will now pray for God’s peace upon people of good will, and the invocation “we bless you” has been restored from the Latin to the litany of praise.

LOVE OF GOD

It’s easy to tell when two people love each other. They like to be near each other and spend time together. They share intimate thoughts and feelings. They enjoy making each other happy. And knowing that they are loved allows them to reach out to other people and treat them with love and respect.

In this Sunday’s Gospel Jesus tells us that the greatest law is to love God with our whole heart and soul and mind. What does it mean to love God? Certainly it means spending time together by reading and reflecting on God’s holy word. It also means sharing our thoughts and feelings with God in prayer and listening for God’s voice. Where do we go to be close to God? We join God’s people in worship in the church, rest in God’s presence in the Blessed Sacrament, discover God in the wonder of creation and the miraculous moments of daily life. What can we do to make God happy? How do we, like the Thessalonians, “serve the living and true God” (1 Thessalonians 1:9)?

The Sound of Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion, and then there is movement, a bustle of activity, as we prepare to join the Communion procession. This holy meal does not happen in silence! Instead, we sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We must change and move to receive the Eucharist, and fittingly so, since the Eucharist is transformative—it demands action of us, internal as well as external. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is also a profession of faith: “The Body of Christ.” “Amen.” “The Blood of Christ.” “Amen.” We acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist with our “Amen” of faith, but more, our “Amen” is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. We receive him not that he may become a part of us, but that we may become a part of him—part, too, of all the others who receive him, the whole communion of believers.—Corinna Laughlin, © Copyright, J. LOVE OF NEIGHBOR

The reading from Exodus makes it very clear that we serve God by serving those who are oppressed or in need. Jesus makes it more personal—we are to love our neighbors. That means those with whom we work and play and live. When we spend time with God we can’t help but experience God’s great love for us. And knowing that we are loved by God should make it easy to reach out in charity and justice to our neighbors both near and far away.

Thus, love of neighbor flows naturally from those who love God. We cannot truly say that we love God unless it shows in loving relationships and compassion to those in need. At the same time, we cannot maintain our love of neighbor unless we take time to drink from the wellspring of God’s refreshing love.

Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. Please call the parish office to sign up for a class and begin the process. Baptisms are celebrated during the Mass. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

House Blessings
