Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

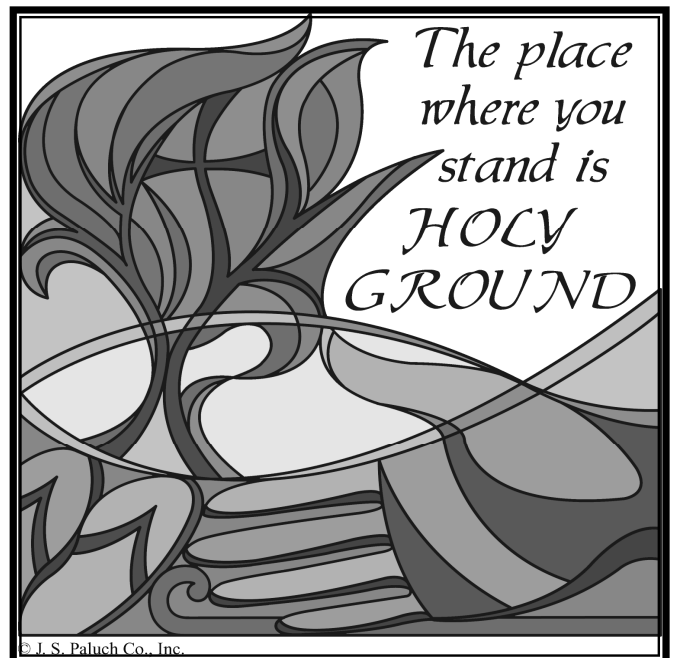

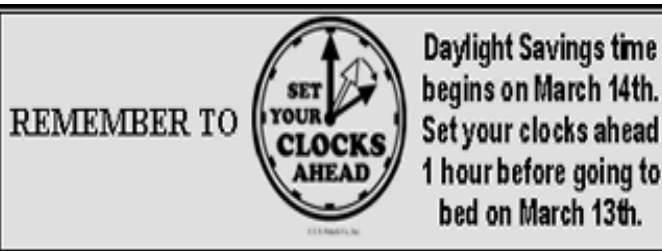
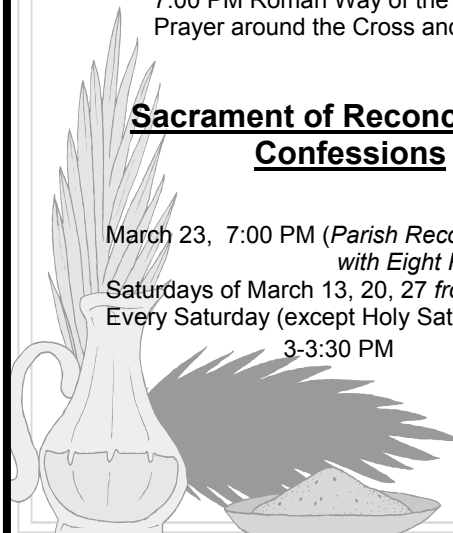

Stewardship

The following is a listing of parish financial obligations:

NEEDED WEEKLY: \$33,655.00
NEEDED MONTHLY: \$145,835.00
NEEDED ANNUALLY: \$1,750,000.00

We need to raise \$ 252,000.00 from other fundraising and program income. This will bring down our weekly *expectation* from collections to \$29,375.00. We average about \$24,100.00 a week. That means each week we fall short \$5,500.00. The monthly mortgage for the Parish Center is \$31,768.00 and whatever we don't have when the payment is due, must be taken out of our "less than substantial" savings, which will soon disappear.

My dear parishioners,

On the First Sunday of Lent we sent those who are preparing to celebrate their sacraments of initiation at Easter (Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist) to the Cathedral. There they enrolled their names in "The Book of the Elect" during the Rite of Election.

Today and for the next two weeks during our 8 a.m. Sunday Eucharistic celebration, we will experience (celebrate) a different rite called a Scrutiny. What are the scrutinies?

The church tells us they are "rites for self searching and repentance and have, above all, a spiritual purpose." The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all the weak, defective or sinful hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the Elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, truth and life.

Since these scrutinies are not celebrated at all the masses, not everyone in the parish will be able to experience the actual rite, but it is wonderful to reflect upon the journey these elect are making and incorporate it in our own life-long conversion process. The Elect can be a source of inspiration that leads us on the same path of spiritual renewal – reconciling with God and His Church – as we prepare ourselves to *renew* our baptismal promises at Easter.

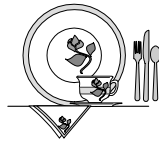
selfless gift Jesus gave us through His suffering and death. Thank you to Jenn Bauchowitz and the all the youth who made this experience possible.

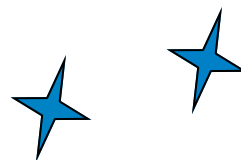
LITTLE CHILDREN'S LITURGY

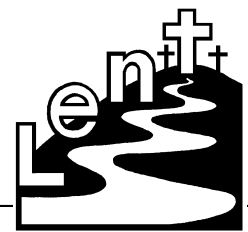
**I WAS BLIND, BUT NOW I SEE:
