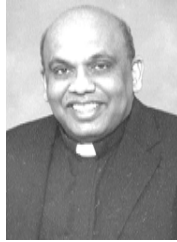

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,



It has become a tradition of our parish to celebrate a special mass with Bishop Pepe on one of our community's favorite days of the year. Thanksgiving Mass will be celebrated on Thursday, November 24, 2011 at 9:00 am and once again Bishop Pepe will preside. Join us as we give thanks to God for the many blessings we received. Be sure to thank Bishop and make him feel welcomed on that day by joining your fellow parishioners.

As you know, on November 27, 2011 we will implement the New Roman Missal. For the last eight weeks we have discussed the upcoming changes and learned about the Missal. We have been catechized about the gestures and responses. I have received much positive feedback and many of you have embraced the changes very well. I would like to thank all of you for your patience, understanding, and willingness to accept and worship according to the new translation.

Last Sunday, I spoke to you about the Our Father. I mentioned to you that the Missal does not designate a hand position for the Lord's Prayer. As I explained, what you do with your hands is entirely up to you. I only ask that you do not hold hands with one another during this time. We want to be sure we embody the symbol of unity at the proper time-when we all stand to receive communion.

Speaking of receiving communion, this week we have a special insert from the Bishop's Conference explain the Reception of Holy Communion at Mass. In it you will find that the instruction says that after you process, you should bow. You may receive communion either in the hand or on the tongue but do not grab the Host from the minister's hand. After the minister says "Body of Christ", you are to respond in a loud and audible voice, "Amen". Once you receive, please do not genuflect, make the sign of the cross, or do any other gesture. By receiving Eucharist you have become the very Body of Christ. To bless yourself or make the sign of the cross, undermines what you have become.

Finally, I would like to share with you some insight on the Gesture of Peace. Many people take this opportunity during mass to say hello to each other, friends, and fellow parishioners. However this time is not meant to be a time of greeting one another. Rather, this is a time of a symbolic gesture that expresses our belief that Christ truly is present among us. The Sign of Peace is meant to express our faith that the risen Christ, the source of all peace, is present in his people. It is both a call to reconciliation, unity, and communion, as well as a

seal which ratifies the very meaning of a Eucharistic assembly whose members both find and pray for peace in one another.

Once again, thank you all for the positive response to the Missal. Continue to do your best to learn the new responses and be patient with one another. May God bless you all.

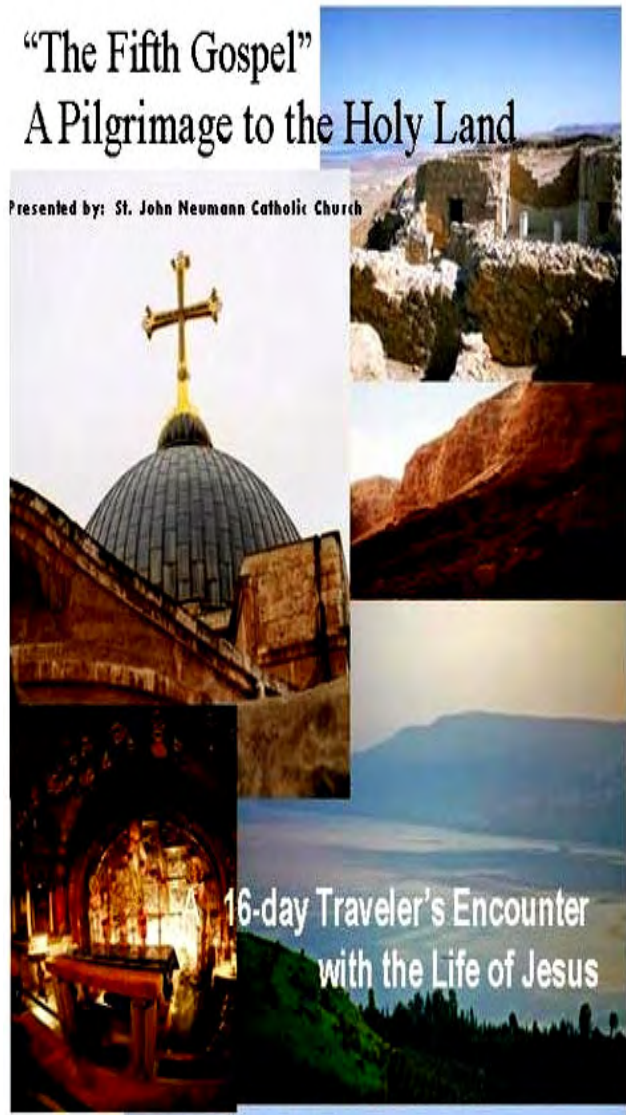

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:


For over 40 years the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has funded organizations that address the root causes of poverty in their communities. CCHD works for the relief of those oppressed by poverty by empowering neighbors to help one another eliminate these causes. This annual collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs.

CCHD funds the Las Vegas Valley Interfaith Sponsoring Committee to bring diverse faith and community based institutions into a broad based organization-of-organizations capable of addressing some of the valley's most pressing issues impacting families. Building on the social teaching of the Church LVVISC is researching issues pertaining to children/youth and vulnerable elderly, the heart of an agenda for education and action. Even at this early stage, 8 months before the Founding Community Convention on May 22 of next year, LVVISC has begun to impact the savage realities of trafficking minors for purposes of prostitution. The abandonment of many elderly in their last years, foreclosures caused neighborhood blight and concern for the education of all children/youth in the valley, these concerns lie at the heart of the call for a collaborative response by faith and community leaders. CCHD is playing a vital formative role as a catalyst for this new organizational venture.

Through CCHD the Catholic Church is working to break the cycle of poverty, and defend human dignity. Please be generous in your support of this upcoming collection to be taken in the diocese on November 20. Please remember, 25% of the Collection's proceeds stay here in our diocese to fight poverty in our communities and defend the dignity of our neighbors.

Preparing For the New Translation of the Mass (part 11 of 12)

New Words in the Communion and Concluding Rites

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of *The Roman Missal*. This week, we conclude our survey of some of the changes in the words and phrases that we will pray.

The priest invites us to come forward to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord by calling us to the “supper of the Lamb” and we will respond: “Lord, I am not worthy / that you should enter under my roof, / but only say the word / and my soul shall be healed.” This calls to mind the Gospel story of Jesus healing the centurion’s servant (Matthew 8:8).

When we are blessed and dismissed from the Mass to continue living our Christian mission, we recall the presence of the Spirit one more time in the dialogue “The Lord be with you.” “And with your spirit.” The priest or deacon will have two new options for the dismissal: “Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord” or “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” Our response—at Mass and each day—is “Thanks be to God!”

Unfortunately, the stories of the saints have not always helped us.



Some of us believe we have to have extraordinary gifts like them to do anything worthwhile. Not long ago a scientist set up an experiment. She matched people recently diagnosed with multiple sclerosis with people who had had the same illness longer. She expected the newly-diagnosed would show an improved outlook with a new “buddy,” and this proved true. Surprisingly, the outlook of the helpers improved even more. Just the listening and befriending made all the difference. Think carefully about what your true abilities are and use them for welcoming, spreading joy, making peace, healing, or comforting.

WITH LOVING HANDS

So often we are defined by the work that we do to make a living. Unpaid work or volunteer work is almost invisible, even though its value to families and to our society is immense. Work done in the home, such as rearing children, is invisible and is not counted in the gross national product, the official evaluation of productivity of our society. The work of rearing children, of guiding adolescents, of donating blood, helping in libraries, delivering meals to seniors, raising funds for not-for-profit organizations, and so on, is coming up short as people are pressed to give more and more of their time and energy to paid jobs.

Our “job” is what we do, but our “vocation” is who we are. We are called to serve others, to help those who need us in a variety of situations. We aren’t all called to the same work, or the same amount of work. We give what we have, according to our abilities, in fidelity to the call each of us received. Our vocation to serve others is rooted in our baptism. How we live our call is a matter of individual gifts and “talents.” Even if our work is unpaid or unappreciated, it is valuable in God’s eyes. Work done “with loving hands” is worthwhile and good, even if it is invisible to those who decide what is economically valuable.

COME, SHARE YOUR MASTER’S JOY

We may not work at what society calls a “full-time job” (defined as being paid). Anyone who cares for children or for ill or frail family members would be grateful if the work ended after a “normal” number of work hours! Work done for love and for the good of another is work indeed, and its payment will be in a different currency. Our call to serve is a call to love, and the payment is joy in God’s presence and in the knowledge that the reign of God is being brought closer each day by the work of our hands.

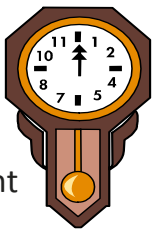

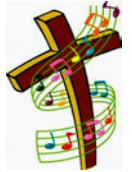

Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. Please call the parish office to sign up for a class and begin the process. Baptisms are celebrated during the Mass. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.
