### Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. *Please call the parish office* to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

### Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

### Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

### Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

### Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

### Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

### House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

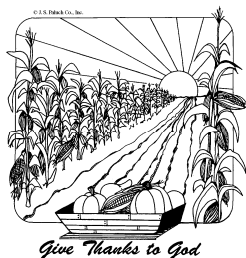

### **SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI (1850-1917)**

#### **November 13**

Burly longshoremen glared  
at the woman in widow's dress who  
interrupted their drinking to beg  
money, in broken English, for her orphanage.  
The bar exploded in laughter as one man  
responded by spitting in her face. "That was for  
me," the woman smiled. "Do you have anything  
for the children?"



Given today's national debate, could it be  
as much God's sense of humor as God's will for  
our sanctification that our first "American" saint  
should be an immigrant and naturalized citizen?  
Frances Cabrini, adopting the name "Xavier,"  
confided to Pope Leo XIII her longing to follow  
her Jesuit patron to Asia. But the Pope replied,  
"Not East—*West!*" So she and her Missionary  
Sisters of the Sacred Heart exchanged exotic  
dreams of China for the impoverished reality of  
Italian ghettos across the United States and  
Central and South America.

Before her death, Frances had founded  
seventy educational, health care, child, and  
family service institutions. Today, from Siberia  
to Ethiopia, in sixteen countries, Mother  
Cabrini's sisters and lay associates embody her  
practical spirituality: "Let's get to work! We'll  
have eternity to rest!"

# Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

Last Friday's Annual Fall Festival was a very successful event! Many thanks to all who planned the evening, those who worked so diligently, our sponsors and also everyone who came to enjoy the festivities. Thanks for everyone's participation in our biggest fund raising event of the year. You are wonderful!

Throughout this month of November, our parish has the tradition of celebrating the commemoration of all the faithful departed whose names have been written on the All Souls Envelopes. These souls are included in a special "All Souls Novena of Masses that runs until the first Sunday of Advent. We continue to pray that they will be embraced in the presence of God. This ancient tradition of writing names comes from an ancient tradition called necrology ("List of the Dead"). The list was kept in monasteries and was the way in which the dead were remembered. Our faith proclaims that we need not fear death; that death is merely the entrance into the great banquet of the lamb. These names serve as a reminder of what we believe.

Every Sunday as we recite the Creed, we confidently state that we believe in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. It follows, then, that we should pray for those loved ones who have died because their souls continue to live on.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1032 teaches us about the practice of "prayer for the dead which is mentioned in Sacred Scripture: 'Therefore, [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin.' From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance done on behalf of the dead."

In this month of November, let us do something for the poor that are served by our outreach program (almsgiving). Each week, we serve about 300 hungry families with a bag of food. The cost of this service is about \$30.00 a bag. Other ways to give alms are: a blanket for a homeless person as our thermometer drops and so many are cold; a basket of food for a family for a day or for a week; a tank of gas for a struggling family, gift cards for groceries and other necessities (e.g. Albertsons, Smiths, Wal-Mart); Spam (that can be eaten without cooking); diapers, etc.

Let us help others and in so doing, commemorate the memory of our dead. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, so too, will our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation. Let us not hesitate to help those who have died, by offering our prayers for them as well as offering our personal sacrifices on their behalf.

Houses of worship and faith-based communities around the country observe Donor Sabbath as a way of bringing attention to the critical need for lifesaving organs and tissue for transplant. Every major religion in the United States supports organ, eye and tissue donation as one of the highest expressions of compassion and generosity.

Organ, eye and tissue donation allows you the opportunity to give someone the hope of restored health, sight and mobility. Consider giving that hope to the more than 100,000 people in need of lifesaving organ transplants and the hundreds of thousands more in need of corneas and tissue.

### ***Facts About Organ, Eye and Tissue Donation***

**FACT:** People of all ages and medical histories should consider themselves potential donors.

**FACT:** Your medical condition at the time of death will determine what organs and tissue can be donated.

**FACT:** Tissue is needed to replace bone, tendons and ligaments lost to trauma, cancer and other diseases in order to improve strength, mobility, and independence. Corneas are needed to restore sight. Skin grafts help burn patients heal and often mean the difference between life and death. Heart valves repair cardiac defects and damage.

**FACT:** All major religions support organ, eye and tissue donation as an unselfish act of charity.

**FACT:** Donation should not delay or change funeral arrangements. An open casket funeral is possible.

**FACT:** There is no cost to the donor's family or estate for donation. The donor family pays only for medical expenses before death and for funeral expenses.

**FACT:** In the United States, it is illegal to buy or sell organs or tissue for transplantation.

**FACT:** It is possible to donate life to others as a living kidney or partial liver, lung, intestine or pancreas donor.

**It is important that your family understands your decision to donate.**

## **PARACHUTE PACKERS**

Charles Plumb was a U. S. Navy jet pilot in Vietnam. He flew seventy-five combat missions before his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plumb safely ejected and parachuted into enemy territory. He was captured and spent six years in a Communist prison before his release and return to the United States.



One day, when Plumb and his wife were having a meal in a restaurant, a man came up to their table and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier *Kitty Hawk*. You were shot down!" "How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied. Plumb gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man pumped his hand and said, "I guess it worked!" Plumb assured him, "It sure did. If your chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today."

Plumb couldn't sleep that night, thinking about that man. "I kept wondering how many times I might have seen him and not even said 'Good morning, how are you?' because I was a fighter pilot and he was just a sailor." Plumb thought of the countless hours the man had spent below decks standing at a long table, carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each parachute, holding in his hands the fate of someone he didn't know.

So, who's packing your parachute? Like Charles Plumb, everyone has someone who provides what they need to make it through the day: a physical parachute, mental parachute, emotional parachute, or spiritual parachute. Let us remember to say hello, please, or thank you, to congratulate someone on something wonderful that has happened to them, give a compliment, or just do something good in return.

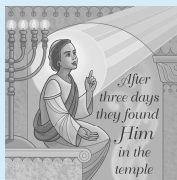
