TRUST IN GOD

On this final Sunday of Advent our scriptures focus on the historical birth of Jesus, who is son of David and Son of God, child and king, Jesus and Emmanuel.

Isaiah the prophet begs Ahaz to ask for a sign, to allow God to offer him reassurance of the survival of the Davidic dynasty. The king hypocritically refuses to "tempt the LORD" in that way (Isaiah 7:12), but the prophet foretells the birth of a son, an heir to the throne, who will prove the Lord's enduring protection of God's chosen lineage on the throne of David. The child will be called Emmanuel.

Matthew's reference to this history in his description of the birth of Jesus highlights the contrast between the faithless refusal of trust shown by Ahaz, and the complete trust in God shown by Mary and Joseph in bringing about the birth of Jesus Christ. © Copyright, J. S. Paluch Co.

The Christmas season begins this coming weekend. No matter what all the media says, it does not begin after Halloween or Thanksgiving. This time *prior* to Christmas has been built up to a commercial frenzy to entice everyone to buy gifts with reckless abandon. Once Christmas Day is over, their chance to increase profits is over, and as far as they are concerned, Christmas is over too. But this notion is false. This season of rejoicing begins with Christmas Day and continues through the Epiphany until the Baptism of the Lord on January 9. This year we have 16 days to celebrate. So let us keep Christ uppermost in our minds and hearts as we decorate and prepare for the Christmas Season. Remember also the soldiers that are away from home during this season. Pray from your heart for them and that they may come home safely and that their adjustment in returning to this country is without difficulty and that the effects of war will not continue to plague them. Extend your celebration of Christmas through feasting with others during this joyful time. Feast on delicious food, and also upon the Word. During this time we have to relax, we can reflect on the incredible gift of love that God has given to us and that we are able to share with others. As you buy for your dinner, pick up a few extra items to share with them. Outreach has been deluged with requests for help – if you can, please share some of your bounty.

Although it may be a difficult time for some, our hope is to sell all 200 tickets at \$100 each. If we can do this, the parish gets \$10,000 and the other \$10,000 is divided between the three winners (\$6000, \$3000, \$1000). FEAST OF FAITH

Gathering

When Pope Benedict XVI visited the United States in 2008, tens of thousands gathered in Yankee Stadium to celebrate the Eucharist with him. What made them different from all the other excited crowds who have assembled there through the years? When they began to sing together, to listen together, to pray together, they ceased to be a crowd, and became a liturgical assembly. It was not where they were but what they did that set them apart.

The Gospels speak of many instances when Jesus prayed alone to his Father. But Jesus also put a special value on communal prayer. "Where two or three are gathered together in my name," he told his disciples, "there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). Jesus gave his own mission to his followers, sending them forth to do everything he did: to heal, to teach, to proclaim the kingdom. Jesus wants us to meet God in and through each other. So the Christian community continues to gather, Sunday after Sunday.

When we get up on Sunday morning and come to Mass, we respond to Jesus' invitation, and we express our trust in his promise that whenever we come together, he comes, too.

RISKY BUSINESS

Matthew's Gospel today tells us Joseph was betrothed to Mary. Unlike engagement, betrothal was a binding contract. The couple might wait for a year before beginning married life. Sexual activity during the betrothal was frowned upon. If the bride became pregnant by another man, her groom could denounce her, and she would be stoned to death. The alternative was quiet divorce. This would have saved Joseph from humiliation, but would have done nothing to protect Mary.



God spoke in Joseph's dream and told him to take Mary as his wife. God named her child Jesus—the one who saves. Joseph took a risk and said "Yes" to God, without regard for the outcome. Not all women have a "just man" like Joseph to stand by them during pregnancy and birth, or the resources to cope with single motherhood or a child with disabilities. Take a risk like Joseph and commit to offering help.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Training

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Faith Formation Program for children ages 3—12. The purpose of CGS Training is to gather volunteers interested in teaching young children about their faith in a unique manner. We welcome any parents, catechists, religious educators, clergy and other interested adults who wish to follow the very rich, retreat-like course of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This training course helps adults fall in love with God just as the children do in the Atrium.

The course covers:

- An in-depth study of the liturgy and the Bible
- Age-appropriate themes for children from the liturgy and the Bible
- The purpose and use of the handmade material
- An introduction to the Atrium
- Experience in presenting material
- Help in preparing a personal handbook (the catechist 'album')



There are three levels of training courses, and at this time we are offering training for Level I, as each level builds upon the previous course. Level I training will not be repeated within the next few years. We will follow with Level II training in the summer of 2011.

The Association of the **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** grants a certificate upon completion of each approved training course.

To better serve all who are interested, we are offering training one weekend a month for five months. All five sessions need to be attended to complete the course. The training dates are scheduled as follows:

Our Winter Passover



The heart of our faith is the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus, and the fact that what happened to Jesus is our destiny, too. We, too, in various ways and over time, will suffer, die and be raised up — all in the arms of a God who loves us. This is what we call the paschal mystery. We celebrate the paschal mystery every Sunday, and in a most important way once a year, in spring around the time of the Jewish Passover, when we baptize, confirm and welcome to the eucharist new believers at Easter. But did you know that even as we celebrate Jesus' birth in the flesh, we are in fact celebrating the paschal mystery? Have you ever noticed how Christmas is actually a second Easter, our winter Passover?

There are hints all over the gospel accounts of Jesus' birth. When the baby is born, he is wrapped in swaddling clothes; when the man dies, he is wrapped in a shroud. The newborn is laid in the manger, the feeding trough of animals. The man grows up to teach us, "I am the bread of life. If you eat of my flesh and drink of my blood, you will live forever." Angels herald his birth, and angels announce his resurrection to the three women. A star shines over the baby in the manger; the sun hides its face as the man hangs on the cross. And perhaps most ominously of all, the magi — those mysterious strangers — bring gifts that seem sentimental and sweet to us today: gold, frankincense and myrrh. But when this story would have first been told, the original hearers might have been puzzled or even horrified, for these were things people brought to a deathbed: gold coins to put in the mouth (as a sign of paying for the soul to take the ferry across the river of death), frankincense to burn (to cover the odors, and as a sign of the soul ascending), and myrrh to embalm. (Recall that the three women come to the tomb on Easter morning with a mixture of myrrh and aloes.)

And if there wasn't enough blood in the childbirth, recall that after Jesus is born, the Holy Family must flee into exile in Egypt to escape Herod, who slaughters in cold blood all the innocent baby boys of Bethlehem. As an adult, Jesus will right this wrong by shedding his blood on the cross for us all. But note that to protect Jesus, Mary and Joseph take him into Egypt, just as their ancestors had fled there centuries before to escape starvation and find the other Joseph, the son of Jacob. So Jesus ends up living as a refugee and an exile, just as his people had done. And just as they had crossed the River Jordan to enter the promised land after the first Passover, the adult Jesus is baptized in that same river as he begins his ministry that reaches its high point at Passover.

So Merry Christmas — and Happy Easter, too. Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever!

SIM BANG GABI (December 15-23, 2010)

BACKGROUND: In the Philippines, these Masses (nine-day novena) are celebrated early in the morning between 4-5 am and/or in the evening. It is also called “Misa de Gallo” (mass when the cock crows early in the morning). This is a very much desired Filipino religious tradition. Back home families wake up early, attend Mass and pack many churches. After the liturgy, delicious Filipino food and delicacies are served and shared by families. Thus this becomes a religious and social gathering.

ACTIVITIES: In the Las Vegas valley, we celebrate “Simbang Gabi” in different parishes at their regular Mass time. We publicize the schedule in parish bulletins and invite all parishioners (especially Filipino Catholics) to attend, participate & complete the novena. It is recommended that the Pastor/Associates at the assigned parish preside at the liturgy. Other priests are welcome to celebrate. The readings of the day are read and proclaimed. A very simple reception will take place after Mass.
