Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. **Please call the parish office** to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

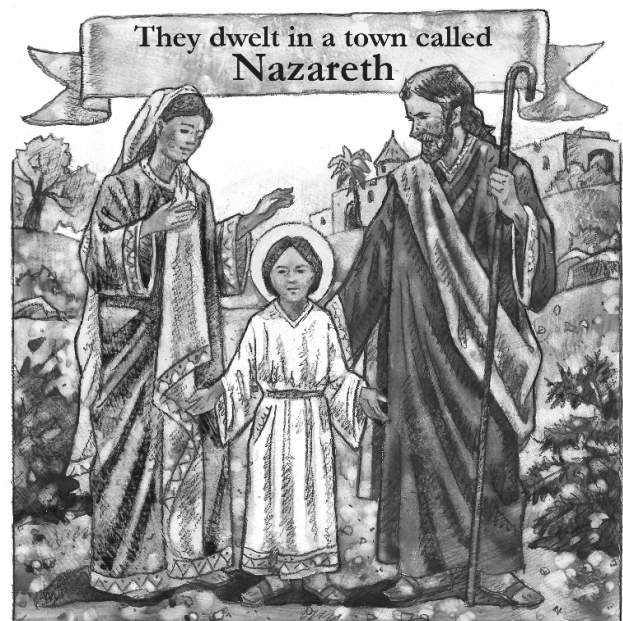

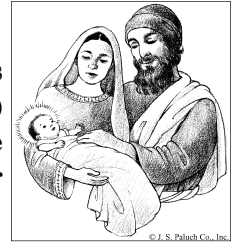

This Sunday is the Feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day.

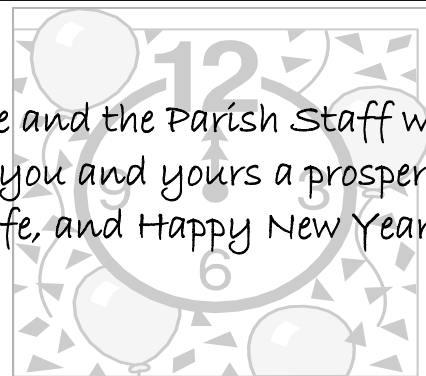
Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including his entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life.

Dear Parishioners,

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This feast day is still within the Octave of Christmas. The message of Christmas is so wondrous that we can't celebrate it all in just one day, so we continue to rejoice for eight days as if it were one.

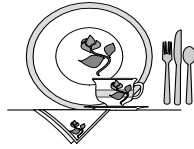
Next week's second collection is for the building fund. This collection is to allow those parishioners who have not yet made a Stewardship commitment to contribute to the growth of our parish campus.

FEAST OF FAITH Processions

Why does the liturgy begin with a procession? It is not just a practical matter of getting the ministers of the liturgy from the sacristy to the sanctuary. The procession is a powerful sign of who we are as Christian people. We are not static, staying in one place. We are going somewhere. Our procession leads us to the altar, sign of Christ's presence in our midst. We move, we process, because we recognize our need for what Christ is preparing for us at that table. We go forward eagerly, because we are hungry for that heavenly food.

This procession is an orderly one: servers, deacon, priest presider. Each is set apart by distinctive vesture: albs for the altar servers, dalmatic for the deacon, chasuble for the priest. The procession is an image of the hierarchical structure of the Church. On a deeper level it is an image of unity in diversity. We are all on a journey to the heavenly city, but each of us is clothed with different gifts. We all receive the call to service, but not in the same way. Only by coming together in all our wonderful variety can we achieve the work of the kingdom.

WHY REGISTER IN THE PARISH?

Many people regularly attending mass at our parish are not *registered as parishioners*. Faith Formation registration is *not* parish registration.

It is important to be registered and to use your donation envelopes so that we have records of your activity in the parish. If you ever request a letter for Baptism, Marriage, Confirmation, a tax statement, being a godparent or sponsor, or if you would like to have your child enrolled in our Faith Formation Program, or many other reasons, we must check our records. We can verify that you attend by seeing your identifiable donations (and/or active participation in church ministry) that have been posted in the computer.

We cannot sign affidavits stating that you are a member of the parish (even if you do attend mass here), if we have no records to that effect. If you would like to register, we encourage you to do so by completing the registration form found in the welcome flyer in the lobby or in the parish office. Please return it either by mail, or placing it in the collection basket, or dropping it off at the parish office.

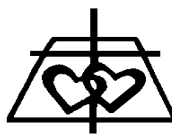

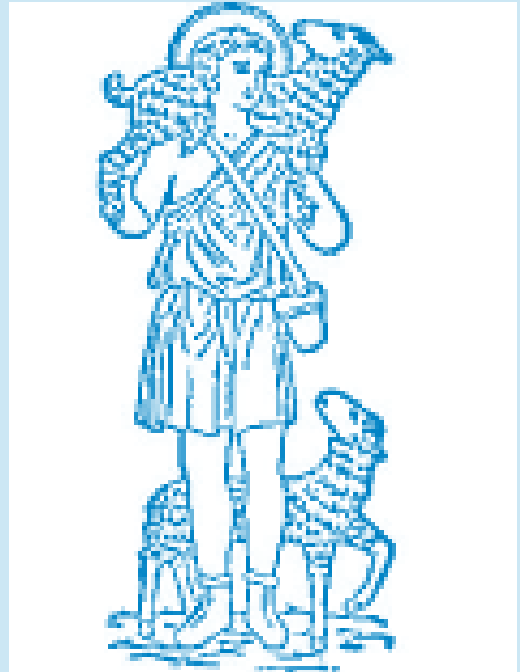
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Training

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Faith Formation Program for children ages 3—12. The purpose of CGS Training is to gather volunteers interested in teaching young children about their faith in a unique manner.

We welcome any parents, catechists, religious educators, clergy and other interested adults who wish to follow the **very rich, retreat-like course** of the **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd**. This training course helps adults fall in love with God just as the children do in the Atrium.

The course covers:

- ◇ An in-depth study of the liturgy and the Bible
- ◇ Age-appropriate themes for children from the liturgy and the Bible
- ◇ The purpose and use of the handmade material
- ◇ An introduction to the Atrium
- ◇ Experience in presenting material
- ◇ Help in preparing a personal handbook (the catechist 'album')



There are three levels of training courses, and at this time we are offering training for Level I, as each level builds upon the previous course. Level I training will not be repeated within the next few years. We will follow with Level II training in the summer of 2011.

The Association of the **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd** grants a certificate upon completion of each approved training course.

To better serve all who are interested, we are offering training one weekend a month for five months. All five sessions need to be attended to complete the course. The training dates are scheduled as follows:

Holy Families

The lovely gospel accounts that we revel in during these days of Christmastime hold up for us the image of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the Holy Family of Nazareth. And so we celebrate the Holy Family on the Sunday after Christmas Day. It's easy to gaze on the images in the Christmas crib and recognize the holiness of the newborn Jesus, his mother and his guardian. It may be harder to look at your own children or parents or brothers and sisters and see reflections of that same holiness in them. After all, living together, you see each other's bad sides as well as the good, the warts as well as the dimples.



But if we truly believe in what we are celebrating, the incarnation of God in the flesh, and the fact that Jesus saved us by his death and resurrection into which we are baptized, then we must cultivate the ability to see a reflection of the baby Jesus' holiness in each child in our own families, to see the holiness of Mary and of Joseph reflected in ourselves as parents and in our own parents.

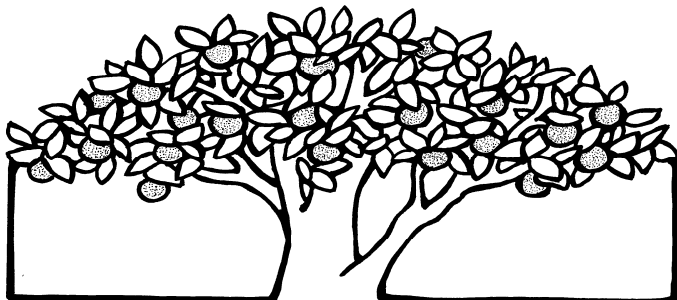
Maybe it will help to remember not just the gurgling baby Jesus in the crib, but also the toddler Jesus at age two — in his own version of the “terrible twos.” Or to meditate on Mary and Joseph changing diapers and picking up the ancient Palestinian version of Cheerios from the kitchen floor — and the living room floor and the bedroom floor and. . . . The gospels are silent about Jesus' childhood, but truly human as well as truly God, Jesus no doubt had nosebleeds and skinned knees, tried dangerous stunts, didn't get enough sleep sometimes and so was cranky. Maybe there were even battles over homework. (Jesus would have studied Hebrew and the scriptures.)

And think of Jesus as a teenager. We get a glimpse of him in the gospel of Matthew at age twelve, wandering off in Jerusalem, causing Mary and Joseph to panic. Of course he didn't have the opportunity to take driver's ed or ask for the car keys, but there were a myriad of other but similar parent-teen encounters, to be sure.

Some may find such speculation to be sacrilegious. “Jesus is perfect,” they'll object. “Jesus is God!” How very true. And Jesus was a baby, a teenager, a young adult, too. True God, true man. And maybe, just maybe one of the delights of this Christmas season is that some of the small quirky things about us as human beings — the terrible twos, the teenage struggle for independence, parents' angst about their child — maybe all of these are holy and part of what it means to grow toward perfection.

Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever!
