#### **House Blessings**

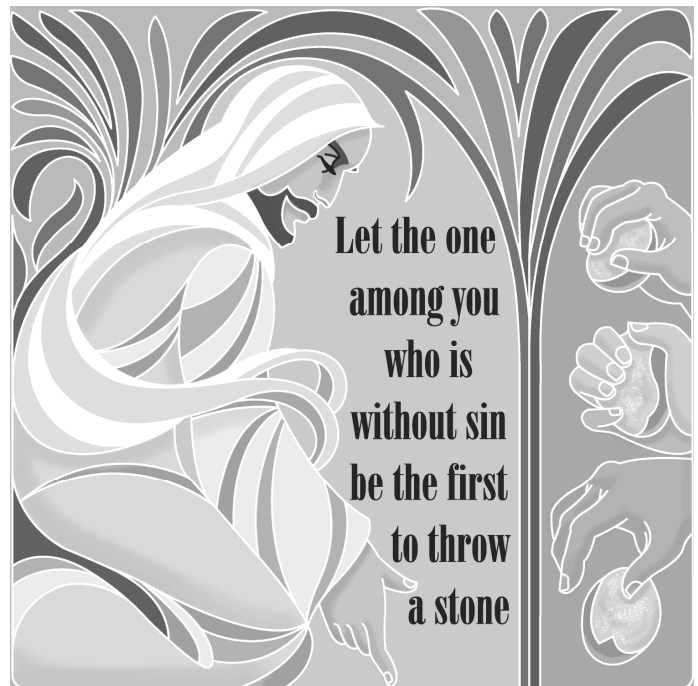
Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

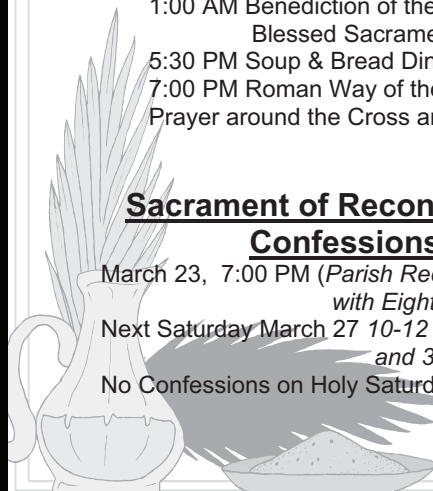

## Stewardship

The following is a listing of parish financial obligations:

**NEEDED WEEKLY:** \$33,655.00

**NEEDED MONTHLY:** \$145,835.00

**NEEDED ANNUALLY:** \$1,750,000.00

We need to raise \$ 252,000.00 from other fundraising and program income. This will bring down our weekly *expectation* from collections to \$29,375.00. We average about \$24,100.00 a week. That means each week we fall short \$5,500.00. The monthly mortgage for the Parish Center is \$31,768.00 and whatever we don't have when the payment is due, must be taken out of our "less than substantial" savings, which will soon disappear.

Dear Parishioners,

Next Wednesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> our parish will have an evening of Reconciliation. There will be eight priests joining us to celebrate this sacrament. As I have been saying and writing in my letters, the season of Lent is the time for us to prepare to renew our Baptismal promises. Celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession is a wonderful way to prepare to celebrate this great feast with a pure and renewed heart and mind. So I invite every one of you to join us this Wednesday to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation.

Today, I would also like to invite those who attend mass here but have not yet registered as parishioners to consider doing so. When a person comes to our parish office and asks for a letter of permission to be a godparent, Confirmation sponsor or a letter of good standing, etc., if we do not have any records, we are not able to provide such a letter. Registration in the parish, then, is of advantage to you. Please also consider that we, as a parish, must know how many parishioners we have in order to adequately plan our programs and services.

Finally, some of our parishioners have asked about CSA. This is the season of the Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA). When we decided to become a stewardship parish (with the Fruitful Vine Program) we said that our CSA expenses would be included in our annual budget. Each week, we set aside \$2,400.00 for this purpose. Last month, we paid the diocese \$97,547.00 as our required assessment.

For those of you who are new to our parish, CSA is the vehicle that we support the apostolic work in the diocese, such as Catholic Charities, Prison Ministry, Seminary and Clergy Education, Faith Formation and Teacher Education on the diocesan level, Hispanic Ministry, Desert Clarion, the TV Masses and so forth. Each parish is assessed according to its annual ordinary income.

The True Vine Stewardship Program is still accepting promises to contribute a certain amount each week (or each month) that is a combination of all pledges, donations and special funds such as this one. We hope that more of our parishioners will participate in this worthwhile program. Forms may be obtained in the parish office. Thank you for continued support of our parish. May God bless you for your generosity.

# FAITH FORMATION

Dear Parents of Little Children's Liturgy,

We have been blessed to have offered LCL over the past few years. We are very grateful to all the catechists and assistants who have faithfully shared their time and talents with this ministry, and all the parents who have assisted us in all the activities.



As you all know Fr. Bede is very dedicated to catechizing children from a very young age; he believes that children must be taught early on about their Catholic faith and the church community.

## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Program.

- Currently serves children ages three to nine.
- Is rooted in the Bible, the liturgies of the church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. (visual, kinesthetic & audible learning).
- The program provides the same opportunity as LCL and much more.

Since LCL and CGS seem to compete with one another for the enrollment of the small children of the parish, and since LCL does not offer continuing faith formation after the age of six, it seems appropriate that these little ones should be directed to the more effective process of faith formation: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. *So after much consideration, Fr. Bede has decided that Little Children's Liturgy will not continue after May 23, 2010.*

Not only will there be LCL on Palm Sunday, but Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will host an open house on Palm Sunday, March 28. Please take this opportunity to visit the Atria (classes) before or after the 10 a.m mass, to find out more about the program.

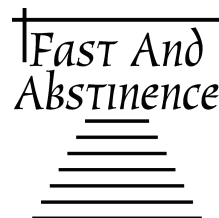
## What is the Paschal Fast

A paschal fast is the fast we make during the Triduum. It begins after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and is broken with the celebration of the Easter Vigil. The paschal fast is different from the penitential fast of Lent. During Lent, we are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. To fast ritually means to eat only one full meal on a given day. We may eat two smaller meals if necessary for strength, but we may not snack between meals. During Lent, it is also customary to "give something up" like sweets or television. These fasts are penitential in nature. They are meant to remind us of our sin and strengthen us to live more Christ-like lives in the future.

The fast of the Triduum is entirely different in purpose. During the Triduum, we are required to fast on Good Friday, and we are encouraged to fast on Holy Saturday. Again, to fast means we eat only one full meal on these days. However, the paschal fast is not penitential. It is almost a joyful fast, a fast of anticipation. It is the kind of fast we experience when something big is about to happen and we are too excited to eat. The fast of the Triduum is also a more complete fast. Some people try to eat less food than they would during other fasts. Ideally, the paschal fast also means a fast from all activity that would distract us from preparing ourselves for the great celebration; it would be good to consider fasting from work, from television, from pleasure reading, from shopping, and from anything that takes our minds and bodies away from prayer and anticipation.

During our paschal fast, we want to keep in prayer all those who are preparing to enter the church through baptism at the coming Easter Vigil. These catechumens are also fasting and preparing at this time, and they are counting on us for our prayers and support.



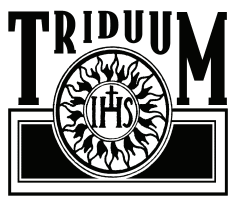

**HOLY WEEK AND  
THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM  
Sunday, March 28 -  
Sunday, April 4, 2010**

"The days of Jesus' life-giving death and glorious resurrection are approaching, the hour he triumphed over Satan's pride, the time we celebrate the great event of our redemption" (Preface of the Lord's Passion II, *Sacramentary*).

Thus the Church begins the one week of the year that we formally designate as "Holy." Simple rituals can link the domestic church to parish church and Church universal.

Enthroned Sunday's palms where you pray, behind the family crucifix, even as part of front door decorations: "Christ reigns here," they proclaim; "all are welcome!"



During the first three days of Holy Week, ready Easter clothes, prepare festive foods, clean the house, beautify the yard. Late Holy Thursday afternoon, share

Lent's final meal before the Lord's Supper Mass. Pitcher, bowl, and towel make a fitting centerpiece; perhaps conclude the meal by washing each other's feet.

On Good Friday, observe the paschal fast from food—from TV and computer, too! Then come to Holy Saturday's Vigil with mind clear, stomach empty, and heart full of "holy anticipation" that bursts into living flame when the new fire is kindled.

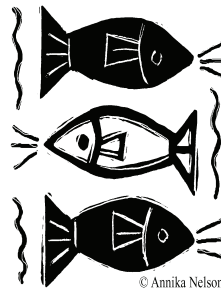

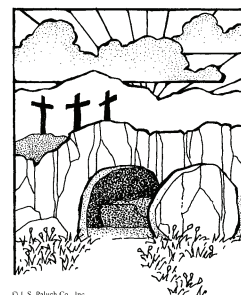
