### Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. **Please call the parish office** to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

### Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

### Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

### Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

### Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

### Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

### House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

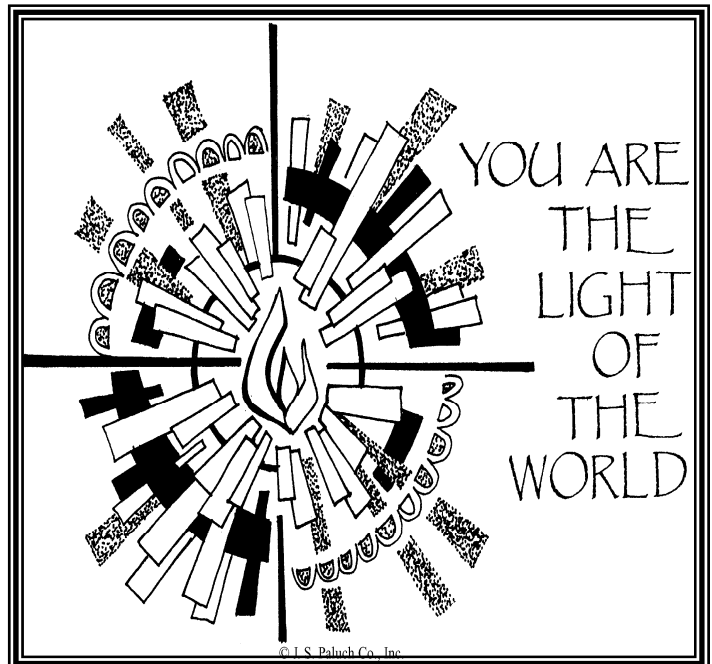

**February 11, the 8:00 AM Friday Mass  
will include the Anointing of the Sick**

*The aged, those with illnesses and disabilities and  
those about to have surgery are invited to take ad-  
vantage of this sacrament.*

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Church, most commonly administered to the dying, to all who are gravely ill or are about to undergo a serious operation, for the remission of sins and the provision of spiritual strength and health and to help a person recover his/her health. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be repeated as often as is necessary.



This sacrament recalls the early Christian use, going back to biblical times. When Christ sent His disciples out to preach, “they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed them” (Mark 6:13). James 5:14-15 ties physical healing to the forgiveness of sins: “Is there anyone sick among you? Let him bring in the priests of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith shall save the sick man, and the Lord shall raise him up, and if he be in sins, they shall be forgiven him.”

Dear Parishioners,

Probably by now you have heard that Nancy Hoover is retiring from her position as parish secretary at the end of this month. She came to us in April of 1999 to volunteer in our church office. Then on February 9<sup>th</sup>, she continued to work in the office, but in an official ("paid") capacity. During the years that she has been secretary here, she also worked with me on the production of the Diocesan Newspaper, *The Desert Clarion*, until I, myself, passed that torch back to the diocese after 10 years of production. Also being a member of our faith community, she became involved in a number of ministries: choir member, lector, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, a member of the Art & Environment committee, Liturgy Committee, Funeral Committee, Baptismal Preparation Committee, occasional sub for Ministers to the Sick, and has been even known to sub for a catechist in the past (as she has earned certificates for all three levels of the diocesan catechetical certification process). Her husband, Ed, is also a fan of quarter horses and thoroughbreds. So visiting a few racetracks will also be on the agenda.

On the weekend of February 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, we will be having a little reception after all the masses to give everyone an opportunity to say "thank you" to Nancy for her contributions of time, talent and treasure over the years. Although she is *not leaving* our faith community, I know that you join with me in wishing her the best in all her future endeavors.

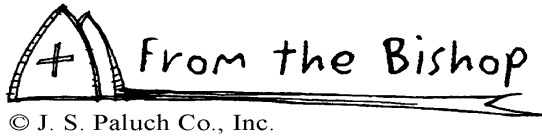

**Tues:** "Jesus in Matthew's Gospel: What can we learn from the Greatest Teacher?"  
**Wed:** "Jesus in John's Gospel: What happens if we truly believe in God's Son?"

Do you realize how strongly different the four Gospels of the New Testament are from each other? Most Catholics don't! We don't recognize how or why the Gospels present four very different "portraits" of Jesus Christ. So on the first day of our mission, we will survey the major differences between Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, and what difference knowing all this can make for our lives as Catholic Christians!

Because we hear readings from Matthew's Gospel at almost all Sunday Masses throughout 2011 (Lectionary Year A), the second day of our parish mission will focus more closely on the distinctive themes and emphases of Matthew, especially with regard to Christology ("Who is Jesus?") and Discipleship ("How are we, his disciples, expected to respond and live?").

Finally, because we use selections from John's Gospel throughout the Season of Lent each year, the last day of our mission will help us see how amazingly different the Fourth Gospel is from the other three. We will come to see how John's Jesus challenges us to hear and believe in him, so that we can receive eternal life and truly become children of God!

You are invited and encouraged to attend all three days of our parish mission (or any one or two days, if you can't come to all three). Each session will include some presentation and reflection, and some time for sharing and prayer. Don't forget to bring your Bible; and bring along your family and friends, too!
