TRUST

Keys hold great significance for those who carry them. They represent the trust and authority of the owner when given to another person. We may give our house key to a trusted friend to take care of our matters while we are away. We may give keys to someone responsible for maintaining or working in a particular building. Keys to vehicles are given to people who have proven themselves responsible drivers. The readings today focus on this kind of trust—the trust that conveys authority and responsibility. In the first reading, the symbol is specifically that of a key; but the second reading and the Gospel also speak of trust and leadership as they refer to the earthly church that Jesus established.

NOT HIRED, BUT CHOSEN

When a company recruits top management the process is detailed and thorough. No company wants less than the best. Contrast this with today's Gospel. Jesus asks his disciples who they say he is. Peter exclaims, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Peter is a good Jew, but an illiterate fisherman, not exactly high on the social ladder. Nevertheless, Jesus saw what this man could become. "You are Peter, and upon this rock [in Greek, *petros*] I will build my church" (Matthew 16:18). The future of our Church, now 1.5 billion people worldwide, lay in Peter's hands. With the power of God, Jesus promised that ultimate evil would never defeat it. Nevertheless, the Church is made up of flawed human beings who sometimes fail. Even Peter himself, Jesus' chosen "rock," failed spectacularly by denying Christ three times. Let's not walk away from failure but strive more to live a faithful Christian life.

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

RUMOR HAS IT . . .

During Jesus' time, there were many beliefs circulating about the Messiah, the Christ, the Anointed of God. Matthew, Mark, and Luke all recount the story of Peter's profession of faith at Caesarea Philippi; only Matthew inserts the portion we hear today in which this in-breaking manifestation of faith for Peter makes of him the rock on which Jesus can found a church. Jesus knows, as he illustrated earlier in Matthew's Gospel with the parable of the houses built on sand and rock, that nothing can endure that doesn't have a sure foundation. We also hear Jesus today immediately follow up Peter's profession with a strict command not to go around right away and tell this to others. The faith that breaks in is the foundation, but it takes time and teaching and discernment to comprehend it adequately in order to tell others about it. Indeed, in all three Gospels, the very first thing Jesus does after he is revealed as Christ through Peter's faith is to begin teaching his followers that to be "Messiah" or "Christ" means to suffer much and to die, neither of which was commonly believed about God's Anointed One.

ON EARTH AS IN HEAVEN

Throughout the Gospels there is a relentless teaching by Jesus that how we live and act on earth is intimately connected to the workings of God's heavenly reign. "Your will be done on earth as in heaven" we pray, along with "forgive us as we forgive others." In Matthew's Gospel the Last Judgment is portrayed with us being told that the manner in which we treated the hungry, poor, lowly, and oppressed is how we treated Christ. Today Jesus gives Peter—and all of us, the baptized, the church—our vocation. We can misread or misunderstand this passage to think that we have been imbued with some sort of control over the workings of heavenly grace and mercy. Rather, Jesus gives us a potent (and a bit overwhelming) charge to live the life of heaven's boundless forgiveness, to be witnesses to him, the Messiah, the Christ who, as he died on the cross to fulfill the work of those names, made his last words, "Father, forgive them." *Today's Readings: Isaiah 22:19–23; Psalm 138:1–3, 6, 8; Romans 11:33–36; Matthew 16:13–20*

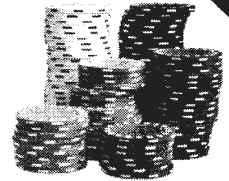

My Dear People,

One of the ways in which the Catholic faith has been made vibrant in our Diocese is through the education and formation that so many have received in our Catholic Elementary Schools. Offering not only a solid experience of academics, they have also provided Catholic identity, fostering the lived experience of our faith. Many leaders in our community were fortunate to have experienced a Catholic elementary education.

Of course, especially as the challenging of staffing schools has become more difficult as vocations of Sisters, Brothers, and Priests have declined through the years, keeping standards high has put financial pressure on our schools. As they have transitioned from religious to lay staffing, operation costs have increased which puts a greater pressure on limited financial resources.

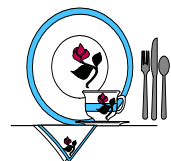

CATECHISTS and ASSISTANTS for CGS, Faith Formation, and Confirmation

The ministry of catechist is one of the oldest ministries of the Church. A “catechist” is one who teaches the principles of Christian dogma, discipline and ethics to prepare people for participation in Christian life. The word “catechesis” means to echo or to resound, an appropriate meaning for what a catechist does in passing of the faith tradition to the children of our parish.

If you can respond to this call, there are openings on:

- ◆ Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays for 4th grade through 8th grade either at 4:00pm-5:30pm or 6:00pm-7:30pm, as well as on Saturday mornings from 9:30am-11:00am. The Wednesday sessions are Sacrament preparation classes. Training is ongoing throughout the year.
- ◆ Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays for CGS assistants. Children range from 3 years old through 3rd grade.
- ◆ Sundays for 9th through 11th grade at 10:00am followed by attendance at the 12:00pm Mass.

To be a catechist, you must:

- be a practicing Catholic
- be in communion with the Church
- complete a Ministry application
- be fingerprinted and attend the *Protecting God's Children* program
- continue your own faith formation

THE QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, AUGUST 22nd

Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture.

Feast of Faith: Come, Spirit!

The presider at the Eucharist can choose from among a number of different Eucharistic Prayers, all of which follow a similar pattern. Almost always, they begin with an *epiclesis*, a Greek word that means “invocation upon” or “calling over here.” At this moment in the prayer, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine that we have brought to the altar: “Father, we bring you these gifts. We ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit, that they may become the body and blood of your Son” (Eucharistic Prayer III). The words of the prayer are accompanied by the ritual gesture of the laying on of hands, the ancient sign of the gift of the Spirit, which is also used in most sacramental celebrations, from the rite of confirmation to the ordination of deacons, priests, and bishops. Liturgists sometimes call this first *epiclesis* the *epiclesis* of consecration. Later in the Eucharistic Prayer, there will be another *epiclesis*, the *epiclesis* of communion, as the priest asks that the Holy Spirit be sent upon us to transform us. “Grant that we, who are nourished by his body and blood, may be filled with his Holy Spirit, and become one body, one spirit in Christ” (Eucharistic Prayer III). —Corinna Laughlin, © Copyright, J. Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. Please call the parish office to sign up for a class and begin the process. Baptisms are celebrated during the Mass. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick
