By virtue of the priestly mission given through Baptism, parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes with the assistance of holy water and appropriate prayers provided by the parish.

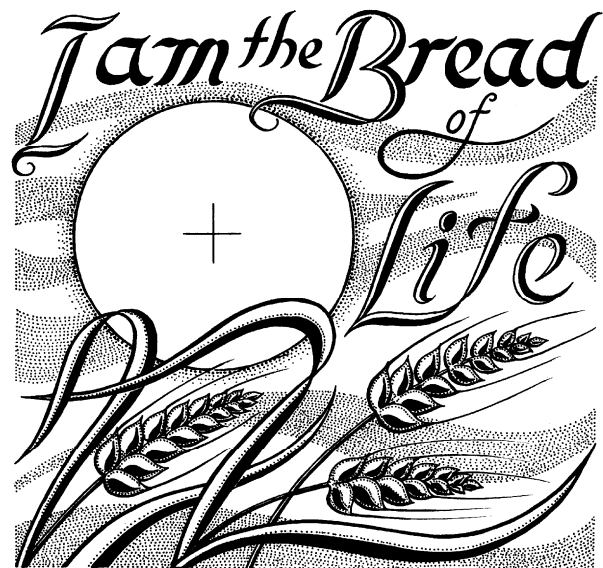

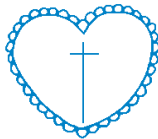

Of course, our highest priority is the food, we so badly need, for the families who come to us, and thank you for coming to our aid so many times. We almost had to close down again last week, but Catholic Charities came through, and we had enough to eke through for the day. But now classes will start soon and we are asking for basic school supplies.

The school system, just like most government systems, is running low on funds, and can't subsidize any supplies. We've given out what we had; many of our families can't afford the prices, so a lot of kids are doing without pencils, notebooks, etc. Bad thing about that is, it points out the kids whose families are struggling, and the kids feel like they don't fit in. So we're asking again: when you bring your can or box of food to church, can you also slip in notebooks, pencils, pens, crayons, folders . . . anything that can be used at school? The stores are now having incredible sales on supplies of all kinds.

We know, it's just one thing after another, but without our assistance, there's no alternative for many.

Thank you for your generosity, and your never-ending compassion for those less fortunate.

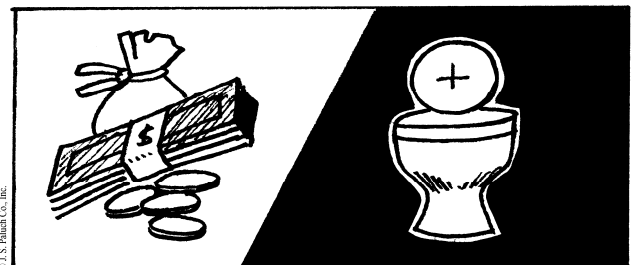

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is an approach to faith formation of children. It is rooted in the Bible, the liturgy of the church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori (visual, kinesthetic & audible learning).

Children gather in a room specially prepared for them, called the Atrium. It contains simple yet beautiful hand made materials that are all child size. All the lessons are hands-on activities. We all know that children love to touch everything they see; this method of teaching is simply that. The catechist will present a lesson to the child through reading a Bible passage, followed by work with materials that help to reinforce the scriptural message.

In working with the hands-on lessons, the child comes to understand the meaning of God's presence in their life and the world. For example; there is miniature replica of the Altar, the Baptismal Font and the Ambo in the Atrium. The children work with the material to understand the significance of the Liturgy, including posture and gestures, vestments and vessels, and sacraments.

CGS Level I is a 3 year process for children ages 4 through 6+ (Pre-K through Grade 1).

CGS II is also a 3 year program for Grades 2, 3 & 4. The children deepen their understanding of Catholic identity, moral teaching of the church and Catholic tradition.

St. John Neumann Church was the first to bring the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd to the Las Vegas Diocese in 2005. We are blessed with two well equipped Atria (Level I & Level II).

We would love to share the Atrium experience with everyone; feel free to walk in for a visit.

Once again this year, Faith Formation will offer a session of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for three-year-olds. The class will be limited to 10 children and will meet on Wednesday mornings from 9:30 am to 11:00 am beginning in September.

At the time of this print deadline, we have received 240 responses to our Fruitful Vine Stewardship Annual Commitment. Thank you to everyone who has faithfully responded to the care of our spiritual home. It's still not too late to respond! Commitment brochures and additional copies of the Fruitful Vine Stewardship Annual Commitment Form are available throughout the parish.

Question: Is this Stewardship Commitment in *addition* to my regular giving (1st & 2nd collections, building fund, CSA)?

Answer: No. The Stewardship Annual Commitment is the combination of all your giving throughout the year into one giving commitment.

In other words, in order to determine what your Stewardship Annual Commitment should be, add together your 1st & 2nd Collection Offerings (weekly x 52, monthly x 12), your typical CSA and building fund commitments for a year. Next, decide how frequently you'd like to give, weekly, monthly etc. Lastly, determine whether you might like to opt for electronic giving if that's convenient for you. Be sure to turn in your Commitment form once you've decided. You can drop your completed form in the offertory basket, bring it to the parish office or send it in the mail <Attn: Finance>.

From the Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of August 2, 2009, the Diocese of Las Vegas will be inviting you to give generously to the Black and Indian Missions and Catholic Home Mission second collection.

Many of our African American and Native American parishes in the United States depend on assistance from this collection in order to assist in their evangelization programs such as Religious Education for children and adults and to assist with the educational needs of students in our inner city schools. Our diocese also benefits from your generosity in the form of grants given to assist in offering Catholic Education to African American and Native American students as well as evangelization programs in parishes.

In addition, this collection also benefits the Catholic Home Missions. The shortage of priests is a growing problem in the United States. It is further complicated by the lack of funding in home mission dioceses, where parishes often struggle with poverty among parishioners, difficult or isolated terrain, religious hostility, and other circumstances that challenge the practice of the faith.

As an example, in the Archdiocese of Anchorage, in Alaska, there are 11,500 registered Catholic families over 140,000 square miles, yet only 30 active diocesan priests. Sadly, such shortages occur often in our United States mission dioceses.

As the Church, we are called to solidarity with our sisters and brothers who need our help to practice their faith right here at home. Please give generously to this very worthy collection.

Thank you for your stewardship and faith!
