Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

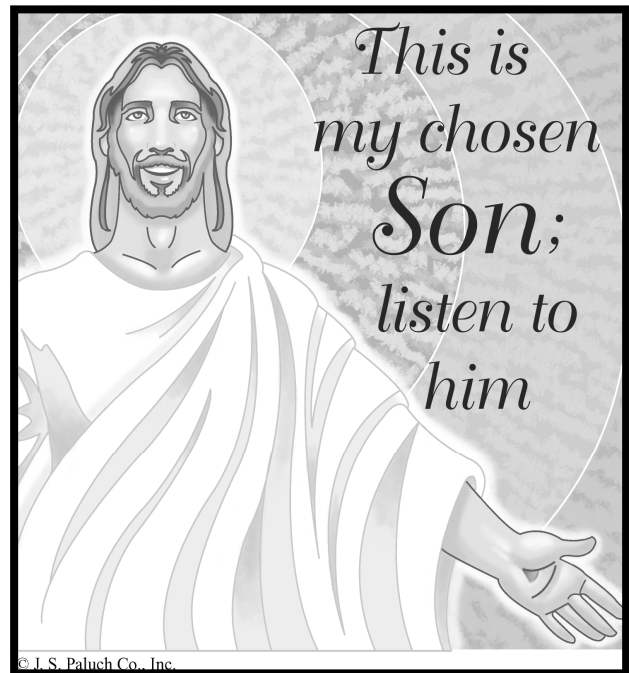

ALL ABOUT CHANGE

On this Second Sunday of Lent the scriptures remind us that when we have an encounter with our God, things are bound to change. In the first reading God tells Abram to raise his eyes to the sky, promising descendants as numerous as the stars. Abram's act of faith in the Lord is sealed in covenant, forever changing the course of salvation history.



In the Gospel story of the Transfiguration, always proclaimed on this Lenten Sunday, the Lord Jesus changes in appearance before the eyes of the apostles who, like Abram, raise their eyes to the spectacle in the sky. It is Saint Paul who brings it all together for us: "He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (Philippians 3:21). Lent is all about change, all about conversion. Let us cast our own eyes to heaven, awaiting that day when we will be changed—when we will share in Christ's glory.

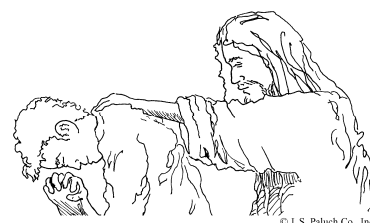
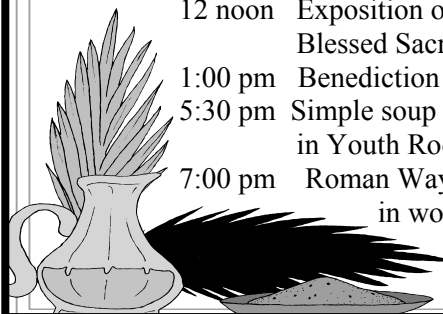

Stewardship

The following is a listing of parish financial obligations:

NEEDED WEEKLY: \$33,655.00

NEEDED MONTHLY: \$145,835.00

NEEDED ANNUALLY: \$1,750,000.00

We need to raise \$ 252,000.00 from other fundraising and program income. This will bring down our weekly *expectation* from collections to \$29,375.00. We average about \$24,100.00 a week. That means each week we fall short \$5,500.00. The monthly mortgage for the Parish Center is \$31,768.00 and whatever we don't have when the payment is due, must be taken out of our "less than substantial" savings, which will soon disappear.

Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

The Sacrament of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. **In the past**, it used to be called Extreme Unction and was usually administered shortly before the death of a person and was the *last* of the three anointings (Baptism & Confirmation were intended to precede it). **Vatican II** initiated a number of changes that sought to better serve the needs of its faithful. One such change was the public image and the administration of this sacrament. They made it known that the purpose for which it was administered was not only to give grace, but also to offer hope of strength and healing to the person who is seriously ill or about to undergo surgery.

It makes good sense then, that one should never wait until death is eminent (if at all possible) to seek this sacrament. It can be administered again and again, if the condition changes and suddenly becomes worse or if the person becomes gravely ill with another sickness. Also, if you know that you are having surgery or are about to be admitted to the hospital, please let us know as soon as possible. There are definite advantages to this:

- In addition to receiving the Sacrament of the Sick, you may also a good confession.
- You will be able to face the impending surgery or crisis of health with a clear conscience.

If, on the other hand, you wait for the last moment before surgery or death, you may not be able to find a priest on the spur of the moment. In this diocese there is one priest for about every 24,000 Catholics. With the number of priests dwindling, the demands on them may cause some grouching from time to time, especially when called out in the middle of the night for nonemergency situations. Do not be deterred from receiving this sacrament. I only ask that if possible, call before the situation becomes dire. Remember, that if you have an emergency and you call, I will come. But please try to understand that a priest is human too. That call could have been the second or third sick call from the same hospital/ neighborhood on the same day or night. In my experience, almost all who call knew of the illness for quite a while before they phoned and could have contacted me earlier and been accommodated during the day and/or in a more appropriate time. It should also be noted that with the exception of St. Rose Dominican Hospital, the chaplains in the hospitals are not Catholic priests and are not able to anoint or hear your confession. There are, however, three priests working as hospital chaplains in this diocese, but not assigned to any particular facility.

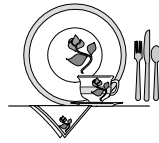

What Teens Need to Succeed, Part 4

As we continue to explore how we as a parish community can better provide for the true needs of our youth we look this week at the asset area of **Empowerment**.

The more a young person is valued and feels valuable, the more likely it is that he or she will grow up healthy.

The empowerment assets are:

1. Community values youth – *Kids perceive that adults in the community value young people.*
2. Youth as resources – *Kids are given useful roles in the community.*
3. Service to others – *Kids serve in the community one or more hour per week.*
4. Safety – *Kids feel safe at home, at school, and in their neighborhood.*



Listed below are some of the Search Institute's suggested ways to enhance our home environments' empowerment assets.

Community Values Youth

- Ask your kids what makes them feel valued. Tips: Children and youth feel valued when 1. adults take time to be with them; 2. adults listen to them and take seriously what they have to say; and 3. adults seek them out and solicit their feedback.
- Attend community events as a family. You'll improve your child's perception of the community and vice-versa.
- Have regular family meetings to plan, solve problems, and encourage each other. Rotate how leads the meetings.

Youth as Resources

- Involve your children in family decisions. Ask for their input and advice. Take their interests, talents, and opinions seriously.
- Provide your children with age-appropriate roles that contribute to your family's well being. Examples: meal preparation, meaningful chores, helping siblings with homework. Remind them often that their roles are important to the family as a whole.
- Ask your child to teach you something – current slang, a song, a hobby, etc.

Service to Others

- Be a role model to your children by serving others.
- Set aside two hours each weekend for serving others as a family.
- Together with your children, help a neighbor.
- Encourage your kids to participate in service activities through their school, youth organization, or parish.

Safety

- Don't tolerate hurtful words or actions in your home. Model loving, respectful behavior toward your spouse, children, other family members, and friends.
- Set clear family ground rules about maintaining physical and emotional safety within the family.
- Keep track of all family members' whereabouts and plans. Let each other know about changes.
- Work with your neighbors to address safety needs and concerns in the neighborhood.

Why Participate in the Nevada 2010 Census? A Brighter Tomorrow for Everyone.



An accurate count of the Nevada population forms the basis for many important, but often overlooked economic and social decisions that may end up affecting our daily lives.

That's why it's so important for you to fill out the 2010 Census form and mail it back promptly. Census data is used for a variety of purposes including appropriating money to the state and local communities, affecting the number of seats for Nevada in the U.S. House of Representatives and helping to guide and inform community decisions.

Every year the federal government allocates more than \$400 billion to the states and communities based partly on census data. Funding is allocated to communities for neighborhood improvements, public health, education, transportation, child care, senior citizen centers and much more. Within our own community, **Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada** receives funding through federal and state grants. It uses these monies to help countless local families in times of need with regard to housing, food and many other necessities.

Completing your census questionnaire is easy. This year's form is one of the shortest census forms in history. It asks about 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. Your participation is essential to ensuring a brighter tomorrow for our communities. We ask that you take the time to participate in this important process.

Pastor's letter continued...

One would need to call a church in order that one of these men could be informed about the need for his services. Remember that at a given time, about 36 out of 100 people are Catholic faithfuls that occupy the beds in hospitals, hospices and homes in the Las Vegas Diocese.

Death is inevitable for all of us. I ask you to please give me a call in the event that someone in your home or a local family member passes away. We will work with you and the mortuary that you choose, and celebrate a Funeral Mass or Liturgy of the Word that will honor the both the past life and the new life that your loved one has entered in a proper way.

Please do not plan the date and time of the funeral and then call asking for priest. He may be attending to another's funeral, wedding, or other scheduled event on the date and time you expected him to be available.

In the meantime, we must always live our lives as if every day were our last. We should take advantage of opportunities for reflection, Christian acts of charity, spiritual renewal and various ways to know God in an intimate way. Lent offers many such opportunities. I especially recommend our parish mission with Fr. Brian Pierce on March 8, 9, and 10.

Those three days (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday) will put us in touch with our Baptismal promises and will help to lead us to the glory of Easter. I hope to see a great turnout for the morning sessions (8 am mass with an abbreviated version of the day's presentation) and the evening sessions (7 pm to about 8:30 pm for the full presentation). Please make every effort to attend. My prayers are with you during this season of preparation and I hope that you will also pray for me.
