Those held at our church are on the 1st Tuesday at 7pm & the 3rd Saturday at 10am each month. **It is necessary to call the office & pre-register for the class.** The Baptism date should be scheduled with the church prior to making plans for the celebration with family and friends.

House Blessings

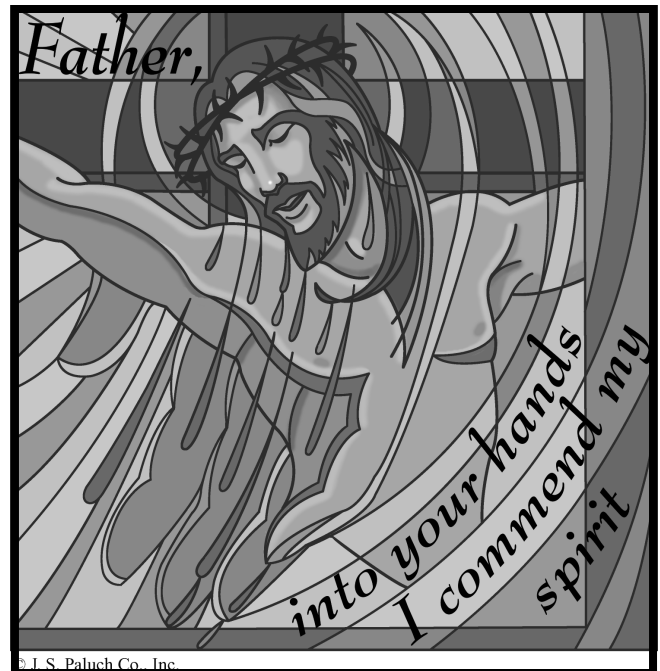
Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

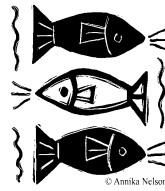

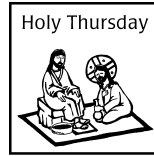

Stewardship

The following is a listing of parish financial obligations:

NEEDED WEEKLY: \$33,655.00
NEEDED MONTHLY: \$145,835.00
NEEDED ANNUALLY: \$1,750,000.00

We need to raise \$ 252,000.00 from other fundraising and program income. This will bring down our weekly *expectation* from collections to \$29,375.00. We average about \$24,100.00 a week. That means each week we fall short \$5,500.00. The monthly mortgage for the Parish Center is \$31,768.00 and whatever we don't have when the payment is due, must be taken out of our "less than substantial" savings, which will soon disappear.

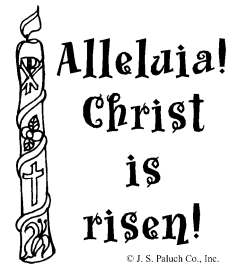

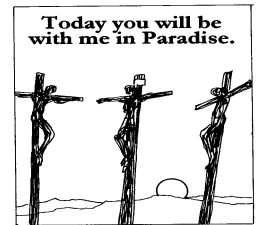

JESUS, REMEMBER ME

Pastor's Notes

The season of Lent comes to an end on the evening of Holy Thursday, April 1, 2010. Then the church begins its holiest time, the climax, the summit, “the culmination of the entire liturgical year”. The church enters the Paschal Triduum or Easter Triduum.



With the celebration of Holy Thursday, the elect and the whole church are called to fast and to pray until the completion of the Easter Vigil. (Thursday night thru Saturday night). This Triduum fasting is not the Lenten fast of discipline and of repentance. This is a fast to teach us of our anticipation and resurrection- the anticipation of Christ and the renewed life he offers. We will come hungry to the celebration of Eucharist on Holy Saturday. Remember that there will be no Eucharistic celebration (Mass) in the whole world after Holy Thursday, Mass of the Lord's Supper until the Holy Saturday Vigil. Are you able to join the universal Church in fasting not only from food but other distractions as well during this time?

Since we started this parish, I have reminded the parishioners that the Triduum is one continuous liturgical celebration. It is not three different events or celebrations. If you are attending one, you need to attend all the three evenings. If not, you have not participated fully in the liturgy. It would be like someone who came late and left early for Mass.

On Holy Thursday at 7 pm, we begin the celebration with the making of the sign of the Cross –in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. When the Mass of the Lord's Supper is ended, we leave without the final blessing as we process with the blessed sacrament to the place of repose. There, people will keep company with the Lord until midnight. I encourage everyone to visit the Blessed Sacrament and spend some time in prayer. The Lord invited us to stay with him at least an hour and pray. How many of us will answer “no”?

On Good Friday at 7 pm, we come in silence and continue our liturgy together. Note that we do not make the sign of the cross at this time, for we are not “starting again.” We leave that evening in silence with no final blessing. Earlier in the day, the Church is open. Please come and visit to pray or do your favorite devotion –perhaps the Stations of the Cross. There will be plenty of books available for your convenience. The Church will be devoid of decoration and symbols. The tabernacle will be empty. No sacraments are celebrated this day or the next.

On Holy Saturday at 7 pm, again we arrive in silence and continue the celebration without making the sign of the cross. But at the end of the liturgy, we not only give the final blessing but give it with a double alleluia! You will notice the same presider and the same ministers are assisting at the liturgy for all three days because (again I tell you) it is one liturgy and not three different events or celebrations.

I believe that each and every Catholic at least once in their life time should participate in the Holy Triduum. It is the most beautiful ritual in the Church year. So plan now to attend this three-day liturgy.

Holy Saturday morning, April 3, we will begin the day with Morning Prayer and preparation rites for those who are about to receive Baptism that evening. Then we will begin the preparation of our worship space for the Easter Vigil. We will also be blessing Easter Baskets and Easter foods in the courtyard at 11 am that day. Please remember the Triduum and Easter Sunday Schedule. We look forward to seeing you in Church. If possible, bring a friend!

Dear Parents of Little Children's Liturgy,

We have been blessed to have offered LCL over the past few years. We are very grateful to all the catechists and assistants who have faithfully shared their time and talents with this ministry, and all the parents who have assisted us in all the activities.

As you all know Fr. Bede is very dedicated to catechizing children from a very young age; he believes that children must be taught early on about their Catholic faith and the church community.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Program.

- Currently serves children ages three to nine
- Is rooted in the Bible, the liturgies of the church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. (visual, kinesthetic & audible learning)
- Requires the children to participate in the mass, but LCL escorts them out
- This program provides the same opportunity as LCL and much more

Since LCL and CGS seem to compete with one another for the enrollment of the small children



of the parish, and since LCL does not offer continuing faith formation after the age of six, it seems appropriate that these little ones should be directed to the more effective process of faith formation: Catechesis of the Good

Shepherd. *So after much consideration, Fr. Bede has decided that Little Children's Liturgy will not continue after May 23, 2010.*

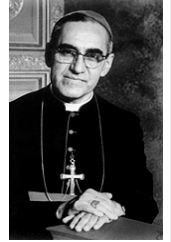
The Catholic Prison Ministry at the Clark County Detention Center (CCDC) is in need of additional volunteers to serve as lay ministers to the men and women incarcerated

TAKE UP YOUR CROSS

Father Oscar Romero was a timid, middle-level church bureaucrat in El Salvador. He silently went along with the wealthiest Salvadorians, who condemned all efforts to help the poor. Under their orders, the military shot strikers, union organizers, human rights activists, teachers, priests, and religious, and death squads freely roamed the countryside, raping, torturing, and killing.



Romero was named Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. When a crowd protesting blatant election fraud was attacked by soldiers in the capital city's main square, the new Archbishop neither intervened nor protested. Then came a sudden turning point: Father Rutilio Grande was murdered along with an elderly man and a boy. The Archbishop knew the Jesuit priest personally. He asked for an official inquiry into the deaths. He continued asking questions and became a marked man. Mail arrived daily at his office saying, "We're going to drink your blood!" "We'll crush you to pieces!" and worse.

In 1979, Romero presented the Pope with extensive reports describing assassinations, disappearances, and human rights abuses in El Salvador. On March 24, 1980, Romero was celebrating Mass. At the end of his homily he said. "Those who surrender to the service of the poor through love of Christ will live like the grain of wheat that dies . . . The harvest comes because of the grain that dies . . . We know that every effort to improve society, above all when society is so full of injustice and sin, is an effort that God blesses, that God wants, that God demands of us."

He was killed with a single sniper shot to the heart. To put other people first is to serve Christ himself, regardless of the risk.

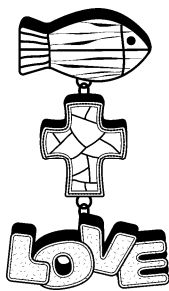

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year.



Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.
