Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions)

Saturday, 3:00 to 3:30 p.m., or upon request during office hours except on Sundays.

Sacrament of Baptism

Sundays during Mass (except during Lent). Parents must be registered and active in the parish for a minimum of three months. Parents & godparents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. Those held at our church are on the 1st Tuesday at 7pm & the 3rd Saturday at 10am each month. **It is necessary to call the office & pre-register for the class.** The Baptism date should be scheduled with the church prior to making plans for the celebration with family and friends.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a member of your family seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion, so that they may inform ministers.

Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

Faith Formation Registration

Registration begins in May for Fall Classes. Call the Faith Formation Office.

Dear Parishioners,

In the United States bishops' pastoral letter on Christian stewardship, they teach us that stewardship involves embracing a Christ-centered way of living which has its beginning in the sacrament of Baptism. The word "stewardship" refers to the Catholic approach to the gifts that God has bestowed upon us. Stewardship is an act of thanksgiving to God and living out a commitment to be Christ-centered rather than self-centered. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and use them to show our love for God and for one another.

There are three areas of stewardship: Time, Talents and Treasure. Accepting the biblical model of returning 10% of the "first fruits" to the Lord, we attempt to utilize at least 10% of our time for prayer, reflection, and works of mercy and ministry. Our individual talents are difficult to fit into a tithing model of returning 10%, but in true Christian humility, we recognize that the gifts that are uniquely ours are not to be used solely for our own satisfaction and profit. Our talents are to be used wherever they are needed. Jesus reminds us: "Where your heart is, so is your treasure."

Over this past year, we've tried to become a stewardship parish through "The Fruitful Vine" Program, which recognizes God as the origin of life, giver of freedom and source of all blessings. Profound gratitude, justice and love become the fundamental motives for giving back to God. Our life, then, is to be lived in gratitude toward God. In a variety of ways, we, as disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, share our time, talent and treasure to build up the Church and make our world a better place. In being good stewards, we must never forget that God loves us and trusts us so much that He has given us the responsibility of managing His estate. Many people are honestly seeking God, but their preoccupation with the "things" they consider to be theirs alone, is blocking the Holy Spirit from moving within them. Our challenge, then, is to joyfully respond to our baptismal call. May you allow the Holy Spirit to guide you!

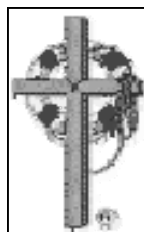

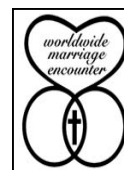

MIXED MESSAGE

Words are funny things. Over long periods of time they can take on new meanings, sometimes the opposite of what they originally meant.



So it is with the word diversity, which originally meant opposite, different. Reactions to our human differences range all the way from suspicion to outright violence. As our world has shrunk through global travel and migration, we have tried to develop ways of making difference or diversity, seem like a positive thing.

One Catholic parish, with significant numbers of new parishioners speaking Spanish and Vietnamese, tried to tackle this in a new mission statement, including some lofty language about diversity. “The concept of diversity includes acceptance and respect . . . appreciating each other and moving beyond simple tolerance to embracing and celebrating the rich dimensions of diversity in a safe, positive, and nurturing environment.”

At a meeting where, once again, complicated arrangements were underway for each language group to have separate liturgies, one person commented that the new mission statement did not reflect any new reality in the parish. “The parish is still separated in worship, in faith formation, and even in community involvement and giving” he said.

Some Anglo parishioners remarked angrily to the pastor that “those people” (other language speakers) do not give “their fair share” (meaning money). Saint Paul, according to today’s reading, would characterize this as “biting and devouring one another” (Galatians 5:15). He reminds us that the greatest commandment is to love our neighbor as ourselves.

What a challenge that is when we sometimes find it difficult to get along even with family and close friends. But, as Christ’s disciples, everyone who comes to our parish is by definition a brother or sister in Christ. Everyone. No exceptions.

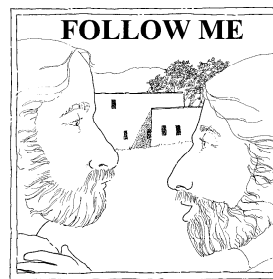

FOLLOW FAITHFULLY

When Elijah calls Elisha to follow him, Elisha goes back, momentarily, to finish some business at home. But note that he does not leave the work to be done by those at home, nor does he plan to come back and finish it himself. He recognizes in Elijah’s call that he must follow faithfully and not look back.

Psalm 16 celebrates the loving protection of God for those who depend on God’s love and mercy. God is our portion and cup, in a line seen by Christians as a poetic reference to Eucharist, and God will not abandon us to death and corruption, but will call us into the holy Presence forever. This could be seen as resurrection, something that was not universally believed in the days before Jesus. We are assured that if we go forth in confidence to follow God’s daily call, we will not be shamed or abandoned, but will find the life we seek.
