#### **Communion for the Sick or Homebound**

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion, so that they may inform ministers.

#### **Funeral Arrangements**

Call the parish office at any time.

#### **Mass Intentions**

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

#### **House Blessings**

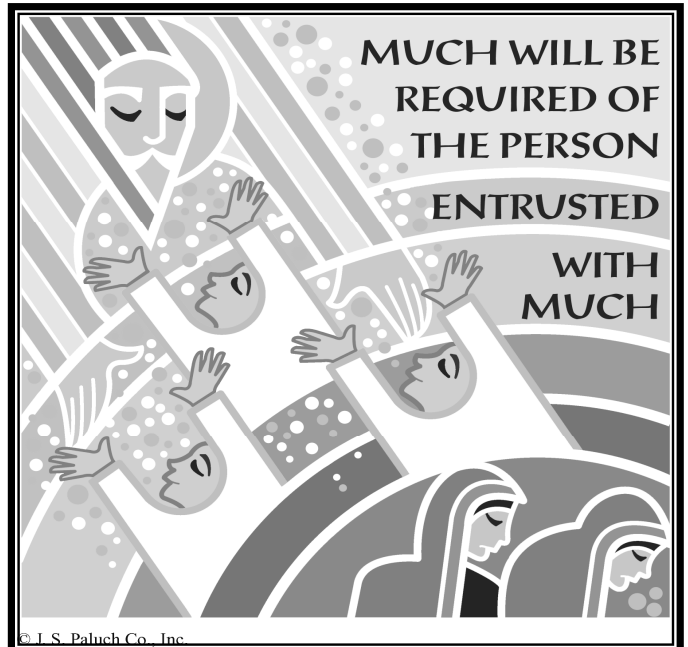
Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

Dear Parishioners,

This month, we are creating a new Funeral ministry. Lay people will be trained and prepared to interact with grieving families and to preside at Vigil Services and Graveside services.

We will also be revamping our Baptismal Preparation ministry. We see from past experiences that many of those who ask for Baptism for their child are from split families, parents that have not been catechized in the meaning and purpose of the sacrament and families that may not have spiritual support from any faith community. It is our goal to help them integrate with the community, understand the sacrament as a moment of prayer and an opportunity to be educated or formed in faith. Instead of having a "class," the new preparation for parents will include a number of meeting times in a "one on one" interaction with a trained representative of our parish. This may include a questionnaire to gauge the knowledge and understanding of the parents involved, mass attendance, talks with the person assigned to them, and a video. The process may take about three months, so we stress to our parents that plans for visiting family members, parties and the like be delayed until a date is selected at the church.

Another sacrament that should again be discussed is The Sacrament of the Sick. Years ago it was called Extreme Unction and referred to as "the last sacrament". But the name was changed about 50 years ago to dispel the myth that it can only be given to the dying. This sacrament is *for the living* and offers a time of special grace and healing. Once a person has died, it is too late to receive this sacrament. I cannot stress enough that one should not wait until the last minute, unless it is an accident or a circumstance in which there was no advance warning. But those with serious chronic illnesses or disabling diseases may be anointed at a time that is convenient for themselves and the priest. Just call for an appointment. Another good time to be anointed is before being admitted to the hospital. You must be the one to tell us, or we may not know. You can also tell the nurse that you are Catholic and would like to see a priest or receive communion while at the hospital and she may call the nearest Catholic Church.

The bottom line is that sacraments are sacred and are opportunities for grace. We should understand why the Lord has instituted these sacraments for us use them wisely for our benefit. May God continue to bless you and your families.

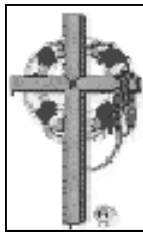

## THE HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS FOR AUGUST 2010



**The Unemployed and the Homeless.** *That those who are unemployed, homeless, or in any serious need may find welcome, understanding, and help in overcoming their difficulties.*

We are praying this month for people in serious need, but especially for the unemployed and the homeless. Certainly Pope Benedict chose this prayer intention with the recent economic crisis in mind. Stock markets may be up somewhat, but the world economy is still fragile. An economic problem in one country affects other countries. Suddenly people find themselves in serious need of help.



The U.S. unemployment rate for the last 12 months exceeds 9.5 percent, which means over 15 million Americans don't have jobs. On any given night, there are somewhere between 700,000 and 2 million homeless people in the U.S. Conservatively estimated, there are at least 100 million homeless people worldwide.

How are we to respond to these people in serious need? First and last, we pray for them. Beyond that, Pope Benedict asks us to welcome, understand, and help them. To welcome someone is to spend time with a person, recognizing that he or she is important to God and therefore to us. Let's remember that in welcoming anyone we are actually welcoming Jesus, for he identified himself with people in serious need. Only by spending time with someone can we begin to understand his or her situation. When we open ourselves to see each person with the Heart of Christ, we find loving and beautiful ways to respond. If we love, any action we do cannot be in vain.

Too often we think that helping the poor is simply a matter of giving money. This month the Holy Father is asking us to be more creative, to get personally involved. In doing so, we have a special opportunity to respect the worth and dignity of those in serious need. We are children of the same Father, so let us treat those in serious need as we would the members of our own family.

### **Reflection:**

How will you become personally involved with someone in serious need?  
In what ways will you welcome, understand, and help others overcome their difficulties?

### **Reading:**

*Luke 9:58* Jesus said to them, "The foxes have lairs, the birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head."
