Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. *Please call the parish office* to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a member of your family seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

PROCLAIM GOD'S GLORY

A threefold message develops in today's readings. First, everyone is called to proclaim God's glory and receive salvation. Second, salvation is not for the unprepared. Like a loving parent, God gently corrects and disciplines those who have been called. Usually suffering is part of the formation process. We are to accept it as Jesus once accepted his cross.

Third, some people who imagine themselves saved are really not. The door of salvation has been closed in their faces despite their cries and pleas. On the other hand, some who are treated with contempt and disdain actually do have a place in God's kingdom.

We need to take these lessons to heart. Recall your initial excitement on hearing God's word. How has the Good News that once caught your fancy taken deeper root in your life? Look again at the crosses you have been given. How are others transformed when they see how you have accepted and grown from your sufferings?

Finally, are there some people whom you imagine are not invited to God's kingdom? Why do you think so? For a moment, imagine them on the inside and yourself on the outside. How might this be possible?

Always try your best to enter by the narrow door. Come and proclaim God's glory.

Dear Friends:

Lately, there have been a number of inquiries regarding our new shrine area with the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe, as well as the mosaic of our patron by the front entrance. We all agree that these are beautiful and very welcome. Some have asked why they have not yet been dedicated or blessed. This is definitely something we want to do, and our own Bishop Pepe can be a part of the celebration if we can be a little patient. I have been in contact with him about his availability. He is able to come to SJNC on Sunday, December 5th to preside at the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. Masses. It will be at that time that the statue of our Blessed Mother and the mosaic of St. John Neumann will be dedicated and blessed by our bishop.

In a way, it is good that we have a little more time to get the memorial plaques and/or pavers done and in place before the ceremony. So if you had been thinking about participating in either of these two special projects, now is a good time to take care of that. Just give us a call or stop in to the office during business hours.

Also, I would like to underscore a situation about which you are all aware. Unemployment is at an all-time high, especially here in Las Vegas. Quite a few of our parish families have had to leave town in pursuit of a job. Our numbers have decreased over the past couple of years from 1867 active registered families to 1394 – a reduction of 473 families. Along with that figure, are corresponding reductions in students enrolled in Faith Formation and so on. Some of our families who remain are dealing with complex financial situations and demanding schedules. Please be sensitive to those in our community that are experiencing this kind of stress. They need our support spiritually, emotionally and materially. Please pray for those who have lost their jobs or have had their hours cut so far back that it is difficult to support their families. Pray also that our leaders make wise decisions and help our nation to recover from this oppressive recession. The healing of our country can be realized with God's help, for in Him all things are possible.

Parishioner Status

A registered member of the parish shall be defined as follows:

“an individual who has formally registered *by completing the parish registration form* and turning it into the parish office (*this is apart and separate from the Faith Formation Registration Form*).

Registering with the parish will insure that you receive all parish mailings, as well as the weekly offertory envelopes. A registered parishioner will remain active and participate by making regular meaningful and identifiable contributions according to their means (*using the parish tithe envelopes or checks*).

Whenever possible, a parishioner should take part in community-building parish functions and share their abilities and talents through ministry.

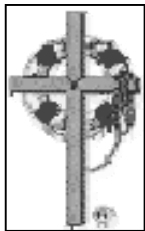
A registered parishioner must attend the Sunday liturgy at their parish of registration a *minimum* of thirty-five Sundays per year. The parish tithe envelopes or checks of any and all amounts are used to register attendance at Mass.”

In addition, those children of registered families, who are of school age and are not already attending a Catholic school, should be enrolled in the Faith Formation program.

Those children who are in high school should participate in the Youth Group and, if not already confirmed, should also be enrolled in the Confirmation program.

(As a side note, the Faith Formation Department is taking registrations for this coming Fall Semester. You can stop by the parish office and pick up the forms to begin the process.)

THE STRUGGLE

Asked to name a saint of our times, many of us would say "Mother Teresa." Born in Albania, she began religious life as a sister in a teaching order, which sent her to a girls' school in Calcutta, India. She was shocked to see the dismal poverty beyond the school grounds.



In 1948, she responded with unquestioned faith to an inner calling: to leave the teaching order and serve the destitute in Calcutta's slums. Very soon other women joined Mother Teresa in her works of mercy, forming the Missionaries of Charity.

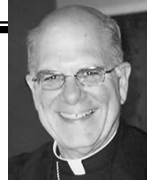
Over the next fifty years, Mother Teresa became a world-renowned symbol of compassion and winner of the Nobel Peace Prize. A book published after her death contains letters she wrote to friends, superiors, and confessors, and reveals that this small, energetic nun had spent long years in a spiritual desert.

She had such deep longing for God, but felt no faith, love, or fervor. Her fame increased, but except for a brief few weeks in 1958, her faith did not return. She said her smile was a mask, as she struggled mightily to see any value in all of her labor: if there is no God, there can be no soul and Jesus is not the Christ. She had even stopped praying for a while because it seemed so meaningless.

Mother Teresa apparently died with her doubts in 1997. Prominent atheists declared that the letters show that all religious faith is a sham. Those of us who struggle with faith are encouraged by her heroism.

Like Saint John of the Cross, Saint Teresa of Ávila, and many others, she kept doing God's will in spite of spiritual darkness. Her dying wish was that her letters be destroyed, but the Church decided to keep them. Perhaps now we know why.

My Dear Parishioners,

One of the primary responsibilities of the Catholic Church is to provide parents with the opportunity to give their children a Catholic educational and formational experience. Catholic elementary schools are established to meet this need and offer a solid foundational experience of academics and Catholic principles and values. In the Diocese of Las Vegas this has been, and continues to be, the goal of each of our seven Catholic elementary schools, which serve not only the parishes to which they are attached, but a community-wide clientele as well.

Those of us, who, years ago, enjoyed a Catholic elementary school education, are also aware of the changes that have occurred, due in no small part to a decrease in religious vocations. Where most of these schools were the beneficiaries of the very dedicated Sisters, Brothers, and priests who regularly staffed both teaching and administrative positions, often with very limited compensation, today we gratefully depend upon the many professional people who devote their vocations as teachers and administrators to the needs of students and parents who still seek this excellent educational opportunity.

With this transition, along with increasing supply and facility operation costs, student tuition has seen a corresponding increase. Realizing the difficulty that this can pose to those in greater need among us, who still hope to have their children attend a Catholic school, the Diocese of Las Vegas this year, on the weekend of August 28th and 29th, initiates this second collection for elementary school scholarship aid in all of our parishes. The funds generated, all of which remain in our diocese, will be used to provide scholarship assistance for children whose families may need financial help to meet Catholic elementary school tuition. An objective assessment process, already operative in some of our schools, will be used to determine eligibility for assistance with the number of children we can help limited only by the donations we receive.

Your support in this appeal will make a Catholic elementary school education possible for many children who otherwise would not have the opportunity. I ask that you be as generous as you can, knowing that your gift will assist in the faith and academic formation of young minds, and hearts. It's the gift of a lifetime, treasured and appreciated by those who have received it, and for which many sacrifice and hope. With your help it will be a worthy sacrifice and a hope fulfilled.

May Christ Jesus bless you and this good work for education done in His Name.

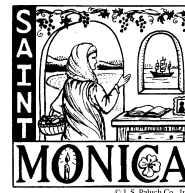

SAINT MONICA (332-387)

August 27

She had smiles for the neighbors, though her husband found her religion and the charity it inspired annoying. She made tearful prayers in private for a son, outwardly self-assured but, as his mother knew, inwardly restless, and whose girlfriend of a dozen years had borne his child out of wedlock.



Though not the first or last such mother and son, Monica and Augustine are the Church's most famous, so we keep their feast days back to back, with Monica's fittingly first.

To Rome she followed Augustine, then to Milan, where years of prayer—and nagging—finally bore fruit in his conversion by Saint Ambrose. For six months, mother and son enjoyed the blessing of rediscovering each other. Just in time! On the way home to North Africa, Monica took sick and died near Rome.

No child who has mourned a parent can read, unmoved, Augustine's tender account, in his *Confessions*, of Monica's last days. At this time of the year, when parents watch apprehensively as children leave for school, may Monica's perseverance and Augustine's long-prayed-for conversion ease anxiety and kindle hope.

The word "catechesis" means to echo or to resound, which is an appropriate meaning for what a catechist does when passing the faith tradition to the children of our parish.

To be a catechist, you must:

- be a practicing Catholic
- be in communion with the Church
- complete a Ministry application
- be fingerprinted and attend the *Protecting God's Children* program
- continue your own faith formation
