Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. *Please call the parish office* to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

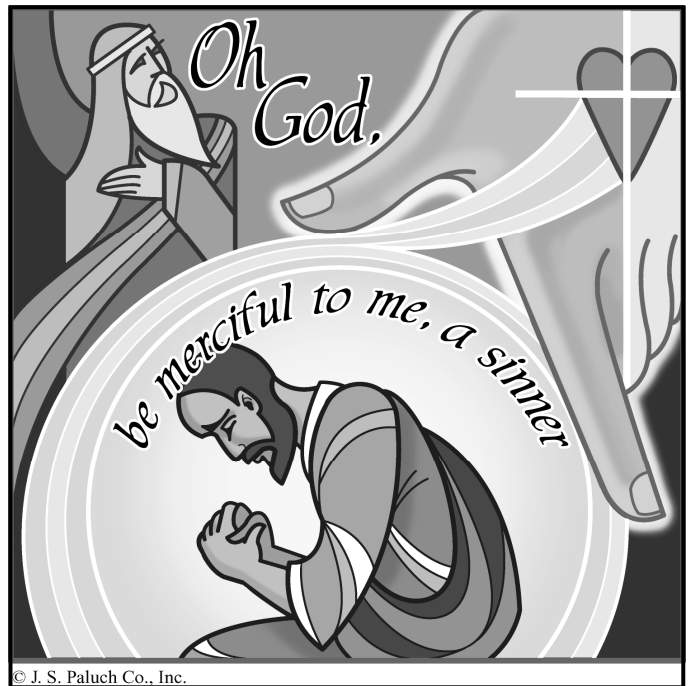

SAINTS SIMON AND JUDE, APOSTLES

October 28

Saint Jude, apostle and . . . Hollywood success story?

Indeed! Beyond Simon's being a "Zealot" for Israel's liberation and Jude's question about Jesus revealing himself (John 14:22), no historic facts are known about either saint.



But Saint Jude's well-known patronage of "lost causes" and "hopeless cases" is largely due to a desperate vow made just before World War II by a struggling entertainer, the son of Arab-American immigrants, Danny Thomas. Unemployed, his wife about to give birth, Danny, attending Mass, impulsively donated his last \$7.00 to the collection, promising: "Saint Jude, if you help me find my way in life, I will build a shrine in your honor!"

Older Americans remember well Danny's long, successful movie and television career. Grateful parents worldwide know the miracles that have taken place for fifty years at his Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital, where needy children are cared for regardless of race, religion, or financial resources, and monumental advances continue in healing and preventing pediatric cancers and catastrophic childhood diseases.

Dear Parishioners,

We need volunteers – for every ministry in the Church, but especially the liturgical ministers at mass. It is sad that we see the same 11 faces serving as Extraordinary Minister of Communion. Many times we have had only one species due to a lack of help. And even though only two lectors are needed each mass, the same people proclaim the Word of God, week after week. It is the same hospitality people ushering – sometimes even staying for two masses a day to help. We may even have to stop the donut hospitality after the 12 noon mass due to a lack of volunteers. At a given mass, we have an average of about 600 people but are unable to find 11 (EMs)+ 2 (Lectors) + 6 (Ushers) + 3 (Altar servers) = 22 people to serve! There is something wrong with this picture. I should think that we would have a huge pool of ministers to schedule so that everyone would have an opportunity to serve *and* to receive service from other members of this faith community. If we desire to be active Catholic Christians, it is more than just coming to church. It is a life of service to others. We begin serving one another and supporting one another while together in our faith community, and then, after being nourished and strengthened in the Body of Christ, we take that service into our homes, our neighborhoods and the world.

Being a servant to one another is biblical. Jesus gave us wonderful examples of this, but he went further and also gave his disciples a directive to become the servant of others. Do we come to Church to be served by others or to serve others? Jesus said, "I have come to serve and not to be served." So the ultimate question we must first ask ourselves is, "Are we truly disciples of Christ?" Once a truthful answer to that question is made, then our path is laid out for us. I pray that our faith community will answer with a resounding YES to this question and take the path that Christ himself has given us.

On the lighter side of service, this is Festival Week here are SJNC. It is our annual fundraiser that puts "f u n" in making money to help support our parish! Everyone that comes has a great time and enjoys delicious food, fun games and prizes. We also have a raffle in which you could win big money! \$1500 is the first prize, so be sure and secure some tickets for yourself. Maybe your friends, relatives and neighbors would like to get in on this raffle. It doesn't hurt to ask. Also be sure to invite them to join you this Friday, the 29th to share in the good times. Everyone is encouraged to come in costume. The kids will love it and so will you. See you there!!!

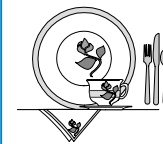

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is very beneficial to those who are seriously ill or about to have surgery. A priest is more than willing to go when the sick person (or an immediate family member if the person is unable to speak for themselves) personally requests the sacrament. It is not appropriate to take calls from friends and neighbors. Unfortunately there have been cases in which the priest was told to leave because the injured/sick/dying person did not request *or did not want* the priest to come.

Therefore, if you learn of a Catholic friend who could benefit from the Anointing of the Sick, suggest to that person or a close family member that it might be wise to contact the nearest priest. **Do not wait until the person is near death.** It may be too difficult to find a priest in time to administer the sacrament. Once death has occurred, the sacrament cannot be administered. It is for the living.

BENEATH THE SURFACE

“Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else,” says Luke’s Gospel today (Luke 18:9), and what follows is the familiar story of the Pharisee and the tax collector, praying near each other in the temple. The Pharisee apparently follows all the religious rules, including fasting and tithing, but his heart is not in the right place. He not only thanks God for making him better than other people, but he lists those he feels are his inferiors, including the man standing nearby.



Why, in the New Testament, are tax collectors regarded with such aversion? Very simply, they colluded with the hated Roman conquerors in collecting the empire’s taxes, and they usually exacted far more than they were entitled to, becoming rich in the process. The Pharisee apparently feels entitled to lump the tax collector together with a list of evildoers. It is a blanket condemnation. But outward appearances can be tricky, for they do not reveal what is in the heart.

In Jesus’ story, the tax collector—part of a despised and corrupt profession—makes no statement of self-justification and no comparisons between himself and other people. Instead, with an awareness of his own sins and failings, he simply bows his head and begs for God’s mercy. Not in prayer, but in ordinary conversation and in silent thought, how often do we compare ourselves to other people?

If we *always* claim superiority over others on the one extreme, or *always* claim that we ourselves are worthless on the other, we are totally distorting the truth. It is a natural to say, “Where do I fit in?” when interacting with other people, but to frame it in terms of superiority or inferiority is not Jesus’ way, nor should it be ours.

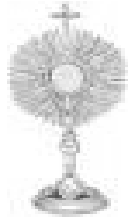

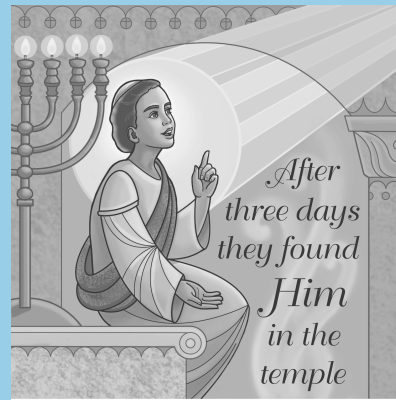
