Sacrament of Baptism

Preparation time for the parents of the child is three months. *Please call the parish office* to begin the process. Parents should meet with one of the program coordinators before choosing the godparents and/or choosing a date for the Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage

Consult with the priest before you set the date. A minimum of six to eight months preparation is needed.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Call the parish office at any time if you or a family member seeks the Sacrament. If possible, please try to call before your loved one is in the active process of dying.

Communion for the Sick or Homebound

Contact the parish office during office hours. In case of hospitalization, inform the admissions office that you are a Catholic and would like to receive communion.

Funeral Arrangements

Call the parish office at any time.

Mass Intentions

Scheduled in the parish office. The calendar fills up rapidly, so Mass intentions may have to be made up to a year in advance.

House Blessings

Parishioners are encouraged to bless their own homes. Holy water and appropriate prayers are provided by the parish.

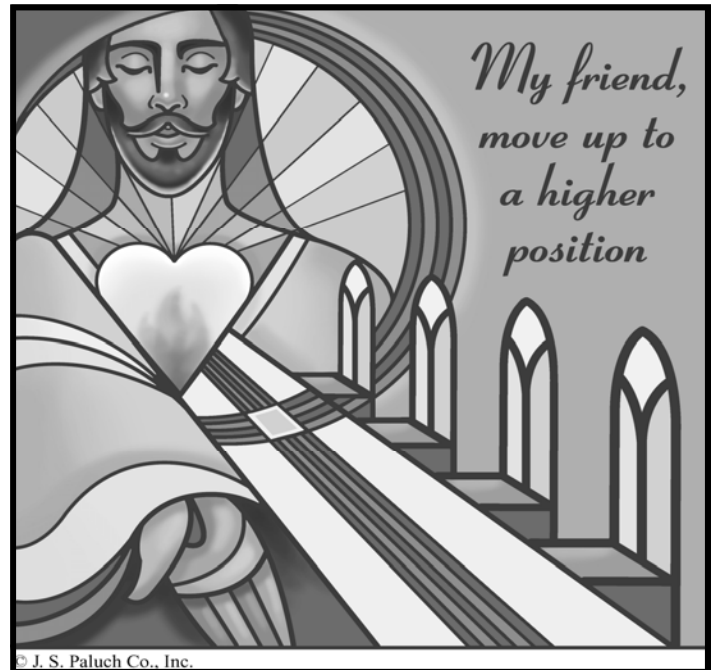

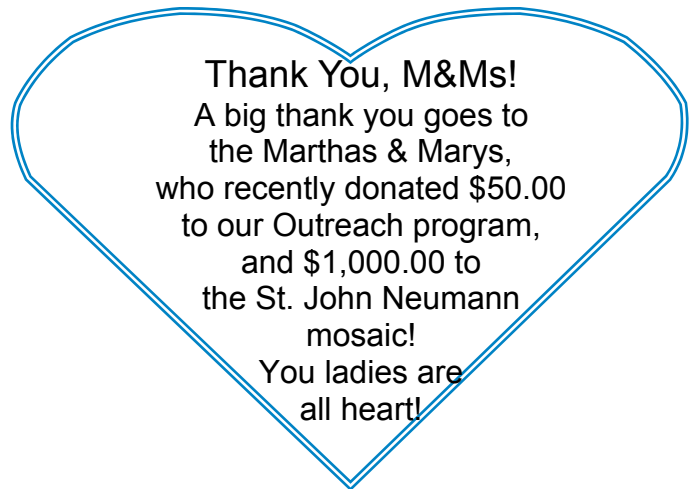

Pastor's Notes

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Dear Parishioners,

One thing that has been evident in my nearly 12 years of presiding at funerals in this parish, is the lack of participation in those liturgies.

As we all know, many of us have moved here from all over the country. We are "implants" in Las Vegas. It may be difficult to gather the entire family together in a timely fashion when a family member dies, especially since most those family members do not live here in Las Vegas. In these cases, only a few may be able to attend a service. Those that do attend do not often even know how to respond to the priest and I suspect that a number of them are not Catholic.

Since burying the dead is a corporal work of mercy, we, as the Body of Christ, are called to comfort one another and assist in the healing process. In the future, I will do my best to inform you (our parishioners) about any funerals or memorials that are pending. The information may appear in the bulletin, through email and the website. I hope you will take these messages to heart and try to attend funerals at our parish whenever it is possible for you. In this way we share the burden with our brothers and sisters in Christ and encourage them during one of the most difficult times in their lives. Remember that when Lazarus died, the friends and relatives of Martha and Mary also came to console and also to mourn with them.

There is a great need for us to see ourselves as children of God, connected by virtue of our baptism and our adoption into His royal family. I hope to see more of you attending the celebrations of our members' new life with the Lord, singing, praying, crying and laughing as we share our lives with theirs.

We are in the process of implementing a new program. Lay people are being trained to meet with the family during this difficult time and work with them in the preparation of a service in memory of their beloved. They will also be presiding at vigil services and graveside services. As soon as they are ready to preside, you will see them at these paraliturgies. It is my hope that you will take this call to participate in this ministry of great importance. I think you will find it very worthwhile.

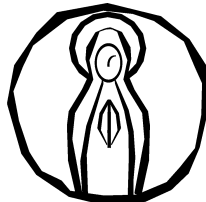

The biblical virtue of humility often gets mistranslated in our world. Many think of humility as ongoing self-effacement or even self-degradation. Humility, as the scriptures use it, is a sense of true self-awareness, of one's capacities and abilities. A false humility is actually a kind of deceit, and is often a mask for the face of arrogance that lies beneath it.

Thus Sirach today tells us not to seek what is too sublime for us, or to search out what is beyond our strength. We are called to have an awareness of what we are able to grasp, and with what we are strong enough to contend.

Scriptural humility also has about it an openness to the goodness of others and what is best in them. That is why both Sirach and Luke's Jesus instruct us not to deny our own self-worth, but to be ready to elevate and acclaim what is good or great in others. When we live this way, we are closer to understanding how God views all of us.

We ought not place ourselves, but others, first. In living this humble way, we are living out of the heart of God, who is always ready to raise us up in honor at the table of the heavenly banquet.

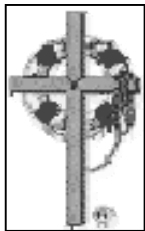

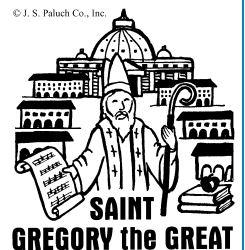
SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT (540-604) September 3

Imagine, fourteen hundred years after death, boasting a best-selling CD! Yet outside the Church and within, "Gregorian" chant is enjoying a renaissance. Still, the timeless sacred music that bears his name is but part of Gregory's legacy. Renouncing civic service for monastic life, Gregory's administrative and diplomatic skills prompted continual summons from the cloister.

Papal ambassador and advisor, he was eventually elected pope himself, renowned as a wise steward of the Church's material possessions, generous benefactor of the poor, sponsor of missionaries, and promoter of monasticism. His liturgical enrichment of the Church endures not only in Gregorian chant, but in eloquent homilies still gracing the Liturgy of the Hours, the "Gregorian Canon" (Eucharistic Prayer I), and his spiritual classic, *Pastoral Care*, once presented to new bishops at ordination. Of countless impressive papal titles—Supreme Pontiff, Vicar of Christ, Successor of Saint Peter, Prince of the Apostles—the title still so cherished that it heads official documents is the one Gregory coined to describe his papal ideal: Servant of the Servants of God. With all Gregory's titles, being designated "the Great" is truly a fitting epitaph.

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Until the Fat Lady Sings

You know the line about opera: “It ain’t over till the fat lady sings.” The same is true about Sunday Mass. And no, the “fat lady” is not the cantor. She’s us—all of us—the church! Sated (miraculously with just a morsel and a sip), stuffed on grace, a bit tired from sincere thanksgiving and sustained praise, the assembly has to finish this liturgy before it’s over. Would the cast leave before the final curtain? The orchestra before the finale? The team before the final buzzer or last out? At Mass, we are all the cast, all the orchestra, all the team.

The end of Mass comes quickly: After the silent revery that follows communion, there is a prayer and maybe a hymn. Some announcements follow, then a blessing and dismissal, perhaps a final song. So is it really asking too much of each other to see it through to the very end? Sure, you might be blocking in someone’s car in the parking lot. But if we all stay till the end, what difference does it make? Of course the little ones are antsy; we all are at this point. A few minutes more won’t hurt. (Nor will cries and squirming now.) And yes, not slipping out early means rubbing elbows with everyone, people jamming up at the doors and a procession of cars crawling out of the parking lot, but isn’t this a consequence of the communion that we just shared? Isn’t this how we know that we are becoming what we have shared: the Body of Christ, risen from the dead, going out into the world to give to others what has been given to us?



It’s a simple act of kindness—finishing the liturgy before leaving. And if we slow down just enough to finish our liturgy, maybe we’ll slowly learn to finish well other things in life, too. And when we learn to relish and not rush the end of things—the last minutes of a movie, the final words of a conversation, the last hand of cards and the final set of pins to knock down—what we are truly learning is to relish and not rush the end of our days—a final act of gratitude that gives God praise.

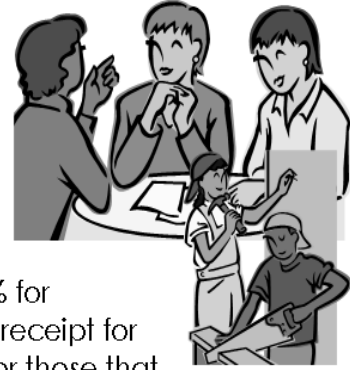

FYI - Here are some stats on where we are:

For active volunteers that are registered in our database, we are 83% for fingerprinting and at 58% for those that have received and signed a receipt for the Volunteer Handbook. Those are great numbers and thank you for those that have already responded.

Our challenge now is to make sure everyone that is in ministry or volunteering is on our active database. Why is this important? For one thing, our parish insurance policy requires that we account for all ministers and volunteers in a report that we file on a quarterly basis. The second reason is that all ministers and volunteers need to complete the volunteer documentation process, about which we have previously spoken in this update.
