A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus. The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers. (Acts 9:26-31)

Can we even imagine the circumstances of Paul? He was the dreaded enemy of the early Christian community who had suddenly come to present himself as *one of them*. Who could blame those early Christians for fearing him? Yet, they found the opportunity to forgive, accept, and even help him. We can see this as a lesson, that no one is beyond redemption.

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." (John 15:1-8)

Is it not interesting that the man who was known as *the carpenter's son* never really gave a parable about carpentry? But, as one who intimately knew the people around Him—fishermen, merchants, tax

collectors, farmers and shepherds—Jesus most often spoke in parables to which His listeners could relate. Here we have one more agricultural parable, that of viticulture or wine growing, as we might say today. More simply, this is a parable about the mutual or *symbiotic* relationship between a vine and its branches, as well as a vine and a vine grower.



Wine is produced in many parts of the world where the conditions of heat and cold, sun and shade, and soil and water all work in perfect relationship. A perfect relationship does not mean, however, that a perfect crop will be produced. Work, attention and knowledge all play into the final outcome. Part of those skills go into knowing which branches produce, and which are worn out; which need to be snipped, and which encouraged as newly emerging buds. The final goal is a healthy vine, with branches that produce much fruit. It sounds pretty simple, and on a purely agricultural basis, the goal is clear.

But this is a parable presented to us in the Easter season, a season in which we have been celebrating the neophytes—the new life—that came into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. It is also a parable of a newly emerging Christian community, whose survival is tenuous, at best. It is also a parable about us and our ongoing growth as part of God's vineyard. Who can survive or produce good fruit if the vine grower does not attend to their needs? Will not all perish? God wants us to produce good fruit, and we, in turn, must cooperate with Him.

As we continue through this Easter season, we are called to help work in the Master's vineyard. We do this by continuing to support and nurture those newly cleansed and welcomed branches of our community. We are also to renew the life-giving force of the Risen Christ given to all of us who also have, at one time, received the Sacraments of Initiation and are continually fed on the Body and Blood of Christ.


We are open the **1st and 3rd Wednesdays** of the month from **9:00 to 11:00am**.


